Attached are the comments of the Minnesota Department of Commerce (Department) in the following matter:

In the Matter of the Joint Request of Princeton Public Utilities and East Central Energy to Modify Electric Service Territory Boundaries

The Petition was filed by Spencer Fane LLP on behalf of Princeton Public Utilities and East Central Energy on 2/6/2025.

The filing constitutes a joint request on behalf Princeton Public Utilities and East Central Energy (collectively the Parties) to update the official service territory map to reflect an agreed-upon permanent boundary change for multiple areas located within the city limits of the City of Princeton and within the electric service territory assigned to the East Central Energy. The proposed change, if approved, will transfer electric service territory from East Central Energy to Princeton Public Utilities.

The Department recommends the Commission approve the joint request for the agreed-upon permanent boundary change from East Central Energy to Princeton Public Utilities and requests MNGEO update the service territory map, to reflect the changes on the map as provided. The Department is available to answer any questions the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission may have.
