## SIERRA CLUB'S EXCEPTIONS AND STATEMENT OF SUPPORT FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S REPORT

August 4, 2025

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On July 15, 2025, the Administrative Law Judge issued a report in the above-captioned proceeding containing findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations for the Commission ("ALJ Report"). The ALJ Report finds that the proposed acquisition ("Acquisition") of ALLETE, Inc., parent company of Minnesota Power, by Global Infrastructure Partners ("GIP") and Canada Pension Plan Investment Board ("CPP") is not in the public interest, and therefore recommends that the Commission disapprove the proposed Acquisition.

Sierra Club fully supports the ALJ Report and its recommendations. The ALJ Report's findings are accurate and well-supported by the evidentiary record, amply demonstrating that the Acquisition's alleged benefits are unproven, and that its risks and harms outweigh the alleged benefits, resulting in net harms.<sup>3</sup> The evidence shows that the Acquisition does not guarantee access to capital, is likely to contribute to dramatically higher rates, may threaten Minnesota Power's compliance with the Carbon Free Standard, and would result in a loss of local control and reduced transparency. Because of these net harms, the ALJ Report correctly concludes that the Acquisition is not consistent with the public interest under Minn. Stat. §216B.50.<sup>4</sup> The ALJ's findings are consistent with Minn. Stat. §216B.50 and all other applicable statutes and rules. The Commission should adopt the ALJ Report in full, with no modifications.

On July 11, 2025, ALLETE, GIP, CPP, and the Minnesota Department of Commerce filed a Proposed Settlement which does not mitigate the net harms associated with the Acquisition. The ALJ Report correctly finds that the Proposed Settlement does not make the

Acquisition consistent with the public interest or tip the balance in favor of approval.<sup>5</sup> Sierra Club's comments on the Proposed Settlement are provided in a separate, concurrent filing.

The ALJ's factual findings are fully supported by the evidence and its legal conclusions and recommendations are sound. Because the record shows that the Acquisition is not consistent with the public interest, Sierra Club respectfully urges the Commission to adopt the ALJ Report in full, follow the report's recommendation, and deny the proposed Acquisition.
