On behalf of Mag Mining LLC (Magnetation), enclosed are brief comments related to two Minnesota Power dockets that are currently pending before the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (MPUC) that have significant impacts on Magnetation's new Plant 4 construction and future operations in Itasca County.

Founded in 2006, privately-held Magnetation Inc. was created with the intention of utilizing magnetic separation technology to capture iron ore particles left over from previous mining operations that existed on the iron range dating back to the 1890s. Magnetation broke ground on its Plant One located near Keewatin, MN in July 2008 and was producing concentrate to northern Minnesota customers only nine months later. Magnetation engineers then designed the Rev3<sup>TM</sup> Separator, an innovative technology that proved to be a solution to processing iron ore tailings.

2011 was a transformational year as Magnetation capitalized on the new technology to begin construction of Plant Two, its 1.2 million metric tonne (mt) per year facility located near Bovey, MN. In August 2011 Magnetation executed a joint venture with Steel Dynamics to construct a 1.0 million mt per year plant near Chisholm, MN utilizing Magnetation technology. In October 2011 the company announced its joint venture with AK Steel to form Magnetation LLC and further expand Magnetation's concentrate production capacity in northern Minnesota and



construct a 3.0 million mt pellet plant facility. Finally, in November 2011 the company completed construction on its Jessie Load-Out rail terminal near Grand Rapids, MN and celebrated its first commercial shipment to AHMSA.

Magnetation continued its growth in 2012 with first concentrate production at its Plant Two in May, just ten months after breaking ground. This facility effectively quadrupled the Company's production capacity. In November 2012, Magnetation announced it would be constructing its 3.0 million mt per year pellet plant in Reynolds, IN to supply AK Steel's blast furnace operations.

In 2013, Magnetation continued to deliver on its business objectives and further expansion in the future. In June the company marked the official start of construction on its pellet plant with the first concrete pour, and is well underway to completing this project on schedule. In order to supply sufficient raw material to the Pellet plant, Magnetation is constructing Plant Four near Coleraine, MN with the same compressed construction schedule as experienced with the other Minnesota facilities.

Currently under construction, Plant Four will produce twice that of Plant Two and represent an additional capital investment of \$155 million dollars and provide excellent employment opportunities for 160 people. These are high paying, skilled positions with an average annual wage and benefit package of \$75,000. This will bring Magnetation's direct employment to approximately 500 people and Minnesota capital investment of \$300 million dollars. **The construction schedule for Plant Four must be met** in order to bring these investments to fruition and secure the company's future as a supplier to the steel industry.

Turning to the two dockets, first, we appreciate the Department of Commerce's (Department) timely and favorable comments dated February 20, 2014 regarding the recently executed electric service agreement between Minnesota Power (MP) and Magnetation. We agree that this new contract is good for not only MP and Magnetation, but for all MP ratepayers and request the MPUC approve the contract. MPUC approval will trigger obligations on Magnetation's part related to operations and transmission service extensions and having that approval will provide us financial certainty.



Second, while the contract approval appears on track, we are very concerned that MP's route permit application for the Canisteo Transmission Project will not be approved in time to allow MP to construct its new transmission lines that are needed before Plant Four can be commissioned. MP filed its application in October 2013 and the MPUC determined the application was complete in your December 17, 2013 order. Our reading of the applicable statute<sup>1</sup> is that the MPUC must make a decision within six months after the determination that MP's application was complete. Also, the December 17, 2013 order stated that the MPUC: "Request that the Administrative Law Judge assigned to this matter emphasize the statutory time frame within which the Commission must make a final decision on the application and strongly encourage the applicant and others to adhere to a schedule that conforms to this timeframe." This requires a MPUC decision by June 17, 2014 at the latest.

However, it appears that timing is at risk without immediate efforts by the Department and the MPUC to expedite matters. Deputy Commissioner Grant signed a scoping decision that set the date for the environmental assessment to be completed as May 30, 2014. I have communicated with Bill Storm from the Department and Mr. Storm has committed to completing that assessment by May 5, 2014. We appreciate those efforts, yet remain concerned that if the MPUC continues with the recent practice of involving an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) as opposed to MPUC staff for determining the adequacy of the environmental assessment and making a route recommendation after briefing it will be nearly impossible to have a decision by June 17, 2014 as required by the alternative review process under state statute. This delay is unnecessary for a transmission project of this size and type and will jeopardize MP's ability to get a new line constructed in time for when power is needed to begin Plant Four commissioning, which will in turn jeopardize the in-service date and our company's future. Magnetation asks that the MPUC and Department work together to meet the statutory timeframe, even if that means having the ALJ host the public hearing or other ways that gives the MPUC the record it needs to make a decision.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments and we look forward to working with the MPUC, the Department and MP to find a way to get Plant Four commissioned on the necessary schedule and adding another 160 new jobs in Itasca County. If you have any questions or would like
