PETITION AND COMPLIANCE FILING

INTRODUCTION

Northern States Power Company, doing business as Xcel Energy, submits to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission this Petition requesting approval of our electric State Energy Policy (SEP) Rider compliance filing and true-up proposal. In our pending electric rate case proceeding in Docket No. E002/GR-24-320, the Company proposed to include all SEP Rider costs in base rates with interim rates; therefore, all costs and present revenues are included in the 2025 rate case test year and interim rates, and we will discontinue use of the SEP Rider until such a time as there are SEP Rider eligible costs in the future. To reflect this proposal, the Company reduced the electric SEP rate factor to \$0.000000 effective January 1, 2025, when interim rates became effective. Because the factor is now \$0, we do not intend to make additional compliance filings in the future.

In this filing, we present the electric SEP Rider actual data through December 31, 2024. We propose to net the final SEP tracker balance with our interim rate refund final adjustment at the conclusion of the rate case as described in more detail below.

We provide the relevant compliance requirements as detailed in the Commission's January 23, 2024 Order in Docket No. E002/M-23-465, which requires the Company to submit an annual SEP compliance report on March 1 of each year.

I. DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF FILING

A. Background

In its September 26, 2003 Petition in Docket No. E,G002/M-03-1544, the Company proposed a single rider recovery mechanism – the State Energy Policy (SEP) Rider – to track Prairie Island Settlement expenses and Reliability Administrator/Sustainable Building Guidelines (RA/SBG) expenses separately but combining recovery into one rider rate. The Commission approved the establishment of the electric SEP Rider tariff and approved recovery of these expense types as requested in its April 6, 2004 Order in Docket No. E,G002/M-03-1544 (the April 6 Order). The Company filed annual compliance filings to adjust the electric SEP Rider rate factor until the Commission approved a zero-rate factor in its December 11, 2013 Order in Docket No. E002/M-13-959.

The SEP Rider maintained a rate factor of zero from January 1, 2014 until March 1, 2024, upon Commission approval of our proposal to update the SEP Rider rate factor to recover costs related to the 2023 Amended Settlement with the Prairie Island Indian Community.² Recovery of these costs is authorized by the amended Minn. Stat. § 216B.1645, subd. 4, which was adopted by the Minnesota legislature in May 2023. Specifically, subdivision 4 authorized additional payments to the Prairie Island Indian Community which were not already incorporated into base rates. The 2024 SEP Rider rate factor was calculated to include only these costs identified in the revised statute:

1) an annual payment of \$7.5 million for each year the Prairie Island nuclear generating facility is in licensed operation, and 2) an annual payment of \$50,000 for each dry cask or container containing spent fuel that is located at the Prairie Island nuclear generating facility, whether or not the plant is in licensed operation.

The Commission's January 23, 2024 Order in Docket No. E002/M-23-465 (January 2024 Order) approved our 2024 SEP Rider adjustment factor of \$0.000258 for all customers which was implemented on March 1, 2024. The Order requires the Company to submit an annual SEP Rider filing on March 1 of each year, beginning on March 1, 2025, detailing the following information:

• The Prairie Island payment expenses including number of dry casks or containers containing spent fuel that are located at the Prairie Island nuclear generating facility.

 A proposed revised electric SEP Rider adjustment, together with a listing and description of all assumptions used to calculate the proposed revised electric adjustment.

We discuss these requirements in more detail below. The January 2024 Order also permitted the Company to discontinue reporting on RA/SBG costs in the SEP Rider filings because those costs were incorporated into base rates in 2014.

II. SEP REVENUE REQUIREMENT CALCULATIONS

A. Electric SEP Rider Tracker Balance

The monthly breakdown of our electric SEP Rider costs, revenues, and actual under-collection for 2024 is provided in Attachment 1. Attachment 1 shows that the actual under-recovered amount in the SEP Rider Tracker is \$1,348,580, based on actual revenue collections through December 2024.

The SEP Rider tracker balance is higher than anticipated because the rate was initially calculated to be implemented over a period of 12 months, starting January 1, 2024. However, the rate was not implemented until March 1, 2024, so we only collected for 10 months, rather than the full calendar year.

The Company reduced the SEP rate factor to \$0.000000 effective January 1, 2025, when interim rates became effective. Costs previously recovered through the electric SEP Rider are recovered through base rates beginning on January 1, 2025 and are not being recovered through any other mechanism.

B. Reporting Requirements

As required by the January 2024 Order, Attachment 2 shows Prairie Island Settlement payment expenses including number of dry casks containing spent fuel that are located at the Prairie Island Nuclear Generating Plant in 2024. In our Petition in Docket No. E002/M-23-465, we forecasted 53 casks for 2025, though we have updated our forecast to 55 casks in 2025 and 65 casks in 2026.³ Costs related to casks in 2025 and 2026 are not included in the SEP Rider, but in interim rates.

The January 2024 Order also requires the Company to propose a revised electric SEP Rider adjustment, together with a listing and description of all assumptions used to calculate the proposed revised electric adjustment. We do not propose to update the electric SEP Rider factor as all costs are included in interim rates, and the SEP Rider rate is currently \$0.

III. TRUE-UP PROPOSAL

In the Company's pending electric rate case proceeding in Docket No. E002/GR-24-320, we propose to include all SEP Rider costs in base rates; therefore, all costs and present revenues are included in the 2025 rate case test year and in 2025 interim rates. To reflect this proposal, the Company reduced the SEP rate factor to \$0.000000 effective January 1, 2025, when interim rates became effective.

In this filing, we present the electric SEP Rider actual data through December 31, 2024. Because the SEP Rider rate is currently \$0, we are no longer collecting SEP revenues through the rider mechanism, but through the interim rate adjustment approved by the Commission in its December 30, 2024 Order in Docket No. E002/GR-24-320. The 2024 costs are trued up in this filing, and the tracker shows an end balance in 2024 before it zeroes out in 2025. We therefore propose to net the electric SEP tracker balance with the interim rate refund that will be made at the conclusion of the pending rate case. This would balance the SEP Rider tracker to \$0. As of December 2024, the SEP tracker balance was an under-recovery of \$1,348,580. We anticipate small changes to this true-up amount due to routine cancel/rebill activity. The Company proposed a similar true-up mechanism for the gas SEP tracker in its March 1, 2022 Compliance Filing, which was approved by the Commission's July 12, 2022 Order in Docket No. G002/M-22-111, netting the final natural gas SEP balance in the interim rate refund made at the conclusion of Docket No. G002/GR-21-678.⁴

The Company believes the proposal to include these costs in base rates and discontinue the current use of the SEP Rider is reasonable because the Prairie Island Indian Community Settlement payments are a predictable and stable cost. Future adjustments to an increase in stored casks would be included in future rate cases. Our proposal to net the remaining electric SEP tracker balance with the interim rate refund in our currently pending rate case is an efficient way to true-up the remaining

balance within the mechanism through which the electric SEP Rider costs are currently being recovered.

CONCLUSION

We respectfully request that the Commission approve our electric SEP Rider compliance filing and our proposal to net the remaining SEP Rider tracker balance in the interim rate refund that will be made at the conclusion of the Company's pending electric rate case. In addition, we request approval to discontinue filing annual SEP Rider compliance filings until such a time as there are SEP Rider qualifying costs in the future.
