This is regard the solar project east of Adams, MN. All the construction sites are on adjacent farms, and not our property. But because of the heavy wooded areas and creeks, this locality attracts an abundance of wildlife. The deer and wild turkeys are especially abundant and seemingly increase their populations over the years. These two groups of wildlife already eat and destroy much of our crops that we have planted, both soybeans and corn. My brothers and I have land in Section 12 of Adams Township (101-16) and we also rent land in Section 6 of Lodi Township (101-15). My fear is that with all the project sites fenced in, that will have a major redirection of traffic patterns of the deer footpaths and flight patterns of the turkeys in their search for food.
