Attached are the comments of the Minnesota Department of Commerce (Department) in the following matter:

In the Matter of the Joint Request of Austin Utilities and Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative to Modify Electric Service Territory Boundaries.

Austin Utilities and Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative filed the petition on March 22, 2024.

The filing constitutes a joint request on behalf of Austin Utilities and Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative (collectively the Parties) to enter into a Transfer of Service Territory Rights Agreement (Agreement). The Agreement allows Austin Utilities to provide electrical service to the proposed two residential homes and six commercial residents in Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative service territory.

The Department concludes that the Joint Request meets the Commission's requirements regarding service area transfers as indicated on the attached checklist and appears to be in order. Therefore, the Department requests MNGEO update the service territory map, to reflect the changes on the map as provided.
