RE: Alternatives Identified During Scoping Comment Period Midwater BESS Project Docket Nos. IP-7138/ESS-24-294; IP-7138/TL-24-295

Dear Mr. Seuffert,

Department of Commerce, Energy Environmental Review and Analysis (EERA) staff has completed the environmental assessment scoping process in the following matter:

In the Matter of the Joint Application of Midwater BESS, LLC for a Site Permit and Route Permit for the up to 150 MW Midwater Energy Storage Project and Associated 161 kV Transmission Line in Freeborn County, Minnesota.

Midwater BESS, LLC, (Applicant) submitted their joint application for a site and route permit on November 19, 2024.<sup>1</sup> The application was accepted by the Public Utilities Commission as substantially complete on January 21, 2025.<sup>2</sup>

The scoping comment period for the environmental assessment (EA) was open from February 7, 2025, through April 21, 2025. Public meetings for the project were held in-person in Albert Lea, Minnesota, on February 18, 2025, followed by a virtual meeting held on February 19, 2025, and an additional in-person meeting in Glenville, Minnesota, on April 7, 2025.

During the comment period, as well as during public meetings, EERA received written and oral comments from the public, state and local units of government, a professional union, and the Applicant.<sup>3</sup> None of these comments suggested an alternative site for the proposed Midwater

Accordingly, EERA staff recommends that the Commission authorize EERA to include in the scoping decision for the EA solely the proposed BESS site and transmission line route identified by the Applicant in its joint application.
