Good morning,

Mr. Davis, thank you for your interest in more detail why the Zumbro Lake crossing does not have adequate room to allow a parallel crossing.

I have a similar interest since it does appear there may be room just north of the current 345 kV crossing. I may need to make a field trip to the area to check it out for myself.

At the scoping meeting in Faribault, Ellen Heine showed me an alternative crossing that they had looked at south of the current crossing and Co Road 12 bridge, just south of Sandy Point. She did not say this alternative Zumbro Lake crossing is not feasible. In my humble opinion, this southern crossing would be less desirable since it does not keep the crossings in the same area, but it may be a buildable alternative.

Hopefully, the 2nd alternative I proposed of adding a substation at the Chester Junction is being evaluated. If the power usage and distribution works, this alternative would eliminate the need to construct any new 161 kV transmission lines for Segment 4 and reduce the environmental footprint.


The City of Oronoco responded with a Resolution 2024-04, in February 2024 supporting an alternative route along the CapX2020 transmission line for the new 161kv power line.

I shared a PowerPoint presentation and comments with Administrative Law Judge Jessica A. Palmer-Denig, June 20, 2024, at the Upper Midwest Integrated Resource Plan in Minneapolis. This presentation highlighted the location of our Lake Shady lakebed which is part of our 90+ acre park that the city has a Master Plan to develop. Having a transmission power line next to Highway 52 ROW and located in an easement in our park is not very eye appealing to residents who want to enjoy the vastness of open space for walking trails, gazebo and other amenities. There is limited space for a power line along the east side of highway 52 where the alternative route 4 East is routed is planned due to cliffs where homes are located next to highway 52. This photo shares the challenges and potential interruptions for a homeowner next to the cliff that was constructed to accommodate highway 52.



The house is located on the bluff next to Highway 52 where the proposed route 4 East would run. The proposed power line/poles might be located on their property and obstruct their view. It may not be within the layout design for the 161kV power line project.

The lakebed of the City park is at the left of the photo which shows the fastness of the park view that the city would like to maintain.





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

The Prairie Island Indian Community ("PIIC" or "Tribe") submits the following comments on recommended scoping for the Environmental Impact Statement ("EIS") required under the National Environmental Policy Act relating to the application of Xcel Energy for a certificate of need and a route permit for the Mankato-Mississippi River Transmission ("MMRT") Line Project.

The purpose of PIIC's comments is to identify issues we believe need to be studied to fully consider the potential human and environmental impacts of the project. In particular, we are focused on potential impacts of the proposed MMRT Project Segment 4 East, which if adopted, would transverse the eastern perimeter of land owned by PIIC known as Elk Run (identified in orange in the image below).

PIIC has invested significant time and resources to develop its Elk Run as a Tribal community in a location where Tribal members can live and work without being impacted by unrelated infrastructure development. Indeed, our Tribe purchased the property at Elk Run specifically to provide our members with an alternative to living on our existing Reservation near Welch, Minnesota, which is located immediately adjacent to the Prairie Island Nuclear Generating Plant and the transmission lines and stored nuclear waste located there. (Ironically, the nuclear plant does not even deliver energy benefits to the PIIC community.) Given this context, we urge that the EIS needs to include study and review of the following potential impacts of the proposed Segment 4 East route on PIIC and its Elk Run property.

• Undue Community Burden & Past Injustices: The nuclear power plant and related utility infrastructure on Prairie Island was constructed without meaningful consultation with our Tribe. PIIC understands and acknowledges that construction took place years ago, and that Xcel has worked diligently to develop and maintain a good relationship with our Tribe. Nevertheless, construction of the nuclear plant disturbed culturally important sites (including burial grounds and historic village sites), which caused cultural and emotional harm to our members. Further, many of our Tribal members are uncomfortable with the nuclear plant's proximity to the homes and businesses on our Reservation, perceiving potential health impacts. PIIC purchased the Elk Run property specifically to provide a refuge for Tribal members wishing to live apart from this major infrastructure project that was built and is operated to serve other communities. PIIC is concerned that construction of Segment

- 4 East will undermine the purpose of its acquisition of Elk Run by perpetuating undue infrastructure burdens, without corresponding meaningful benefit, on a historically disadvantaged Tribal community.
- **Tribal Natural Resources:** The Elk Run property is located within PIIC's ancestral territory and, as such, it holds historical and cultural significance for the Tribe. In this context, after a long and rigorous land planning process, PIIC has identified and set aside for preservation various areas within the Elk Run property that exhibit exceptional natural features such as remnant rare native land cover (prairie and savanna). PIIC intends to protect these sites to ensure that these unique natural resources remain undamaged, and to ensure they will continue to be available to Tribal members for culturally sensitive activities. One prime example is the presence of a prairie remnant directly adjacent to the Segment 4 East route. PIIC has identified this site to be set aside for preservation as the site has never been altered (for example, has never been plowed) and so retains significant prairie biodiversity and intact botanical genetics. PIIC is concerned that the Segment 4 East proposed routes would result in construction in very close proximity to these areas and could have significant adverse impacts. Even just the visibility and presence of large transmission lines could negatively impact sites dedicated to cultural connection. PIIC also is concerned that installation of high-power transmission lines will have direct and illunderstood effects on these and other areas within our Elk Run property. The presence of an electromagnetic field has the potential to negatively impact the biota and the people utilizing the site.

In conclusion, PIIC recognizes the need for local utilities to complete transmission line upgrades and the importance of providing reliable power across Minnesota. However, PIIC believes Xcel Energy and its partners can avoid or minimize these potential impacts by prioritizing either: a) Segment 4 West or b) Segment 4 West in combination with the existing transmission line connected to Segment 4 West, which Xcel identified during public meetings may be repurposed for line upgrades. These alternatives should be fully reviewed during the NEPA process, as they would be expected to have fewer adverse impacts on Prairie Island's Elk Run property.

We sincerely thank the Department of Commerce and Minnesota Public Utilities Commission for the opportunity to comment on the MMRT Project and your willingness to hear our concerns. Thanks for the notice Rich. BWSR isn't an agency that directly regulates activities, however, we do administer a state program to purchase land development rights (via conservation easements) to permanently protect certain lands and natural resources.

I didn't do a thorough review of existing conservation easements along the full proposed route, but a quick review of proposed route 4 did identify lands with conservation easements in that area.

Any permanent impacts to Reinvest in Minnesota (RIM) easements such as permanent structures, clearcutting/tree removal, access roads, etc. would likely trigger the need for an Easement Alteration Request to be submitted by Xcel and considered by BWSR's Board. The Easement Alteration policy is attached. The high-voltage transmission lines would likely fall under the Public Benefitted Project section whereby BWSR would need to be compensated at 2x the current RIM rate for any lands released from the easement if the alteration is approved.

Existing RIM easements can be found via our online map here: https://bwsr.state.mn.us/summary-conservation-lands-county

This data does not identify in-process easements that may also be affected by the transmission lines. Once the proposed route is finalized, we could provide assistance if needed to identify impacts and any easement alterations that may be needed on existing RIM easements.

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Conservation Easement Alteration Requests and Board Policy

December 20, 2017

RIM Reserve Rule Affecting Alteration Requests

MN Rule 8400.3610 - Alteration, Release or Termination of Conservation Easements

The Board may alter, release, or terminate a conservation easement after consultation with the commissioners of agriculture and natural resources. The Board may alter, release, or terminate an easement only if the Board determines that the public interests and general welfare are better served by the alteration, release, or termination.

The Board must be provided the following information at least 30 days prior to a Board meeting, before the Board will consider a request to alter, release, or terminate a conservation easement:

- A. a copy of the letter from the landowner to the district Board justifying the change and identifying how the public interest and general welfare will be better served;
- B. a letter from the district Board recommending either approval or disapproval of the proposed change;
- C. a letter from the Department of Natural Resources area wildlife manager recommending either approval or disapproval of the proposed change; and
- D. other supporting documents, including:
 - 1) an aerial photo identifying the requested change;
 - 2) a soil survey map of the area;
 - 3) cropping history information; and
 - 4) other pertinent documentation that will support the request.

The Board reserves the right to require special provisions to ensure at least equal resource value as a condition of approving the request. The Board must be compensated by the landowner for all damages and loss of benefits to the conservation easement and the Board may also require reimbursement for administrative expenses and costs incurred in the alteration, release, or termination of a conservation easement.

Policy Developed by RIM Committee and adopted by the BWSR on 12/20/2017

This policy applies to all state RIM, PWP and CREP easements currently in place and all future state conservation easement acquisitions. The purpose of this policy is to provide a framework for the BWSR Board and staff on how to implement MN Rule 8400.3610 to ensure consistent and fair treatment of easement alteration requests, conservation benefits are not diminished, and ensure that rule requirements are met.

All easement alteration requests that come to BWSR will be accompanied by a \$500 processing fee per easement. Checks should be made payable to the BWSR. For alterations where actual costs to amend the easement exceed \$500 the Board reserves the right to charge the applicant the actual cost.

Public benefitted projects -

Easement staff has the authority to tentatively approve of releases for public infrastructure projects. However, releases are not considered final until after the release request is presented to and approved by the Board and all fees have been paid.

In addition to the fee as outlined above, public entities must pay:

- 1) Two times the current RIM payment rate for acres released, and
- 2) An amount equal to all state funds dispersed as reimbursement for costs incurred to establish cover on the land being released.

Private landowner requests

All alteration requests that come to the BWSR must contain all the information items requested in Section 8400.3610 of RIM Reserve Rule (items A – D as listed above), plus the \$500 per easement processing fee in the form of a check made payable to the BWSR.

All requests must also meet the following conditions for BWSR approval:

- 1) The resource protection, conservation and habitat benefits for which the easement was originally acquired will remain the same or be enhanced by the proposed alteration. For example;
 - restored wetland acres will not be drained or filled by the proposal
 - riparian buffers will be preserved or enhanced
 - easement configuration will preserve or enhance wildlife benefits (larger blocks of habitat, not fractured puzzle-like boundaries).
- 2) Replacement acres will increase by a minimum factor as follows: Released cropland acres replaced with cropland acres: A minimum of 2:1 (replacement acres to released acres)

Released cropland acres replaced with non-cropland acres: A minimum of 4:1 (replacement acres to released acres)

Released non-cropland acres to non-cropland acre: A minimum of 2:1 (replacement acres to released acres)

Released non-cropland acres to cropland acre: A minimum of 2:1 (replacement acres to released acres)

- 3) Replacement cropland acres proposed as replacement acres must meet crop history requirements, cropped 2 of last 5 years.
- 4) Replacement acres should be adjacent to or as near as possible to the existing easement.
- 5) The ratios above may, in rare circumstances, be altered based upon a best professional judgement recommendation by easement staff that the conservation benefits of the replacement acres significantly outweigh the conservation benefits being impacted.
- 6) Landowners will be required to pay necessary title insurance and recording fees, and all costs associated with establishment of conservation cover practices on replacement acres according to an approved conservation plan.

Meeting the criteria outlined above for private requests does not guarantee that the Board will approve of the request for release and alteration of a conservation easement.



The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has reviewed the application for a Route Permit for the Mankato – Mississippi River 345 kV Transmission Line Project in Southeast Minnesota. Our agency offers the following comments regarding potential environmental impacts, as well as river crossing options, that should be considered in the environmental assessment (EA).

Calcareous Fen

Many calcareous fens (Holden 1 West (13336), Wanamingo 22 (29025), Kasota 7 (34551), McCarthy Lake (31975), Haverhill 19 (31983), and Lime 30 (38219)) have been documented within five miles of the proposed project. A calcareous fen is a rare and distinctive peat-accumulating wetland that is legally protected in Minnesota. The Wetlands Conservation Act (WCA), authorized by Minnesota Statutes, section 103G.223, states that calcareous fens may not be filled, drained, or otherwise degraded, wholly or partially, by any activity, except as provided for in a management plan approved by the commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources. Many of the unique characteristics of calcareous fens result from the upwelling of groundwater through calcareous substrates. Because of this dependence on groundwater hydrology, calcareous fens can be affected by nearby activities or even those several miles away. For more information regarding calcareous fens, please see the Calcareous Fen Fact Sheet. To minimize stormwater impacts, please refer to the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency's General Principles for Erosion Prevention and Sediment Control in the Minnesota Stormwater Manual. Please note that calcareous fens are "Special Waters" and a buffer zone may be required. Calcareous fens may be impacted by activities within the fen, activities that affect surface water flows (e.g., stormwater flow, erosion), or activities that affect groundwater hydrology (e.g., groundwater pumping, contamination, discharge, or excavation). To ensure compliance under WCA, please contact the Calcareous Fen Program Coordinator, Keylor Andrews (Keylor.Andrews@state.mn.us).

Route 3 proposes to use existing right-of-way and pole structures. It will be important to fully understand the temporary impacts that could occur as a result of this project in the McCarthy Lake Wildlife Management Area and Calcareous Fen. The EIS should fully describe the BMPs that will be used, the timing of the work, the equipment and materials, and any temporary staging areas and work spaces in or near the McCarthy WMA. If any existing pole structures are found to be in need of repair or replacement, the EIS should describe what process will be used to ensure that the fen is not impacted. Please be aware that in areas where new pole structures are proposed in close proximity to a calcareous fen, DNR dewatering permits could require longer review periods to ensure that the fen is not impacted.

Karst

Much of the proposed route options in Olmsted County are in close or direct proximity to mapped karst features. The EIS should address how the project will account for karst geology in pole structure design and placement, and what measures will be taken in the event that karst features are encountered during construction.

Natural Heritage Review

Any additional route alternatives considered in the upcoming EIS, including Option 4 West A, should be submitted to DNR Natural Heritage (NH) staff in order to update the January 23, 2024, NH Review letter. Please coordinate with NH Review staff using the Review.NHIS@state.mn.us email address and put MCE# 2023-00832 in the subject line.

On June 24th, 2024, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) and the Minnesota Department of Commerce (DOC) issued a Notice of Public Information and Environmental Assessment Scoping Meetings on Xcel Energy's (Applicant) Certificate of Need (CN) and route permit (RP) applications for the Mankato – Mississippi River 345kV Transmission Line Project (Project). The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) has reviewed the applications regarding the proposed Project and submits the following comments in response to the Notice.

MnDOT performed a cursory Project review and submitted review documentation of those findings directly to the Applicant. MnDOT's review included information exchanged during meetings, emails, MnDOT's Utility ENM process, and available project information to-date. Please consider these findings, particularly pages labeled 41-52 of Appendix M - Tribal and Agency Correspondence Part 2 of 3, in the environmental scope of the Project. MnDOT offers the following additional comments and recommendations for consideration.

For all portions of the Project where parallel installation *within* trunk highway rights-of-way is expected, the Applicant should thoroughly research all existing utilities in those areas. Annually, MnDOT issues several thousand utility permits for small-scale installations within our rights-of-way. The Applicant would be responsible for coordinating with and possibly relocating existing utility conflicts within trunk highway rights-of-way needed for this Project. Diligence in this area would benefit downstream permitting processes, overall project constructability, and overall project cost. Additionally, while the Commission may approve permits for route(s) that fall within trunk highway rights-of-way that MnDOT has previously reviewed and determined are constructable, MnDOT continues to reserve the right to dictate pole placement within those areas. Noting that the Applicant is experienced in coordinating with MnDOT on these types of projects, it is strongly suggested that continued coordination focus on the finer details of MnDOT permitting requirements.

Office of Environmental Stewardship

As a standard part of our review process, all applicable MnDOT utility permit applications are subject to review or rereview by our Office of Environmental Stewardship (OES). These reviews may result in additional construction criteria, extended permit review times, additional Project work inspections, utility permit special provisions, and/or a request to move portions of a planned project outside of any given area of concern. Attention should be paid to MnDOT's OES requested deliverables (also in Appendix M - Tribal and Agency Correspondence Part 2 of 3) that may be required for future utility permit application approvals. Additional consultation may be required to address outstanding issues.

Additional Site-Specific Comments

Within the project area for Segment 1:

1. On the north side of US 14, there is a wooded wetland complex (Figure 1 below) with specific, prohibited actions including clear cutting of vegetation, material filling, water drainage, grade change, excavation and dumping. Placement of transmission line structures in proximity to wetlands must comply with all MnDOT requirements associated with wetland buffers as well as any requirements asserted through the US Army Corps of Engineer's Individual Section 404 permit associated with this wetland.

2. An extension (Figure 2 below) to East Street in Madison Lake (City) north of TH 60 and construction of a new Dollar General Market along with turn lanes to the new street location has recently gone through an approval process in the City and through MnDOT District 7. Plan sheets from the engineer on this project are available upon request. Part of what MnDOT and the City are requiring with this project is that the developer provide sidewalk connectivity to the City's sidewalk network. This is mind, there may be conflicts with infrastructure placement if the new development and Project are not adequately coordinated. MnDOT recommends that the Applicant contact the City to ensure that placement of the transmission poles and lines are coordinated with the placement of the site infrastructure, sidewalk, and the extension of East Street to the north.

Should the Commission issue a Route Permit for the Project, continued coordination with MnDOT staff is expected. Any MnDOT permits required as a part of this Project can be coordinated at an earlier time but may not be issued until the Commission has approved all necessary permits for this project. All applicable permitting, traffic control and construction coordination efforts should be made through the appropriate MnDOT district staff. MnDOT District Specialists should be given the opportunity to participate in pre-construction meetings as they apply to MnDOT-owned property.

MnDOT has a continuing interest in working with all parties to ensure that possible impacts to the entire state trunk highway system, safety of the traveling public and MnDOT maintenance personnel, and environmentally significant areas of concern are adequately addressed.

Applicant's Proposed Alternative for Inclusion in the EIS


At the time of filing of the Application, Xcel Energy was in the process of working with our utility partners to conduct a reliability analysis to determine whether greater portions of the proposed 161 kV transmission line in Segment 4 of the Project could be double-circuited with existing transmission lines in the area. After the Application was filed, Xcel Energy continued to work with Dairyland Power Cooperative (Dairyland) and Rochester Public Utilities (RPU) to complete a reliability analysis to determine that the proposed 161 kV could be double-circuited with the existing North

Rochester – Northern Hills 161 kV line. This analysis concluded that there were no reliability concerns with double-circuiting the proposed 161 kV line with the North Rochester – Northern Hills 161 kV line. As a result, Xcel Energy proposes that this double-circuit route option, as shown in Figure 1, be included in the EIS for further study as an alternative to part of Route Option 4 West. This double-circuit alternative is referred to as Route Option 4 West-A.



Route Option 4 West-A would be an alternative to the equivalent portion of Route Option 4 West which is highlighted pink in the figure above. It would follow the existing alignment of the North Rochester – Northern Hills 161 kV line for 11 miles, from the point where it intersects proposed Route Option 4 West at 75th Ave NW to the North Rochester Substation, and would use the existing 80 foot wide right-ofway. Route Option 4 West-A requires removing the existing North Rochester –

Northern Hills 161 kV structures, which are approximately 85 to 135 feet tall, and constructing new double-circuit 161/161 kV structures, which would be of similar height. This route parallels existing roads for approximately 4.6 miles, and parallels portions of the Douglas State Trail for approximately 3.4 miles. Because it would be double-circuited with the existing line, Option 4 West-A does not require acquisition of new right-of-way, as opposed to the equivalent portion of Option 4 West, which would be constructed parallel to existing lines.

A more detailed map set for this proposed alternative is included in **Attachment A** and a table showing characteristics and potential impacts of Route Option 4 West-A is provided in **Attachment B**.


