Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments on this matter. We respectfully submit this letter supporting a finding that this project meets the certificate of need requirements under state law and rule.

As the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) is aware, and as we have noted in previous comments, the proposed Gen-Tie lines are a critical component in executing the path laid out in Xcel Energy's most recently approved integrated resource plan. With the planned closure of the remaining Sherco coal units, it is important to preserve existing interconnection rights for use in deploying new solar generating assets which will benefit workers, ratepayers, and the environment. The construction of these Gen-Tie lines will help preserve those interconnection rights, while reducing the cost of future wind projects that can "tie-in" directly to the line. The Gen-Tie lines, and the subsequent wind projects that will be built as a result, will also be a source of high-quality jobs for local construction workers.

We would respectfully encourage the Commission to grant a certificate of need to Xcel to construct the Minnesota Energy Connection Project.
