As labor unions representing workers in the construction industry and their families we respectfully submit these comments on the scoping for the environmental review for the proposed Midwater BESS storage project.

As the Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") is well aware, large scale battery storage systems like the ones proposed are going to play an important role in providing back-up electricity to meet some of the grid needs during times when renewables are not generating. As labor unions, we support all-of-the-above energy solutions—including battery storage. We have appreciated the opportunity to meet with applicants and are confident the project will use high-skilled labor that will provide family supporting jobs for local workers. Given that this is one of the first stand-along battery projects in the state, we would encourage the Commission to adopt a scope for an environmental review that is reasonable and not overly burdensome for the applicant or Department of Commerce. Resources like these will be critical for meeting state goals and we should not set a precedent that discourages future development.
