Comments of the Minnesota Department of Commerce

Docket No. E002/M-24-371

On November 1, 2024, Northern States Power Company, doing business as Xcel Energy (Xcel or the Company) filed a petition in Docket No. E002/M-24-371, requesting the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) approve Xcel's 2025 Transmission Cost Recovery (TCR) Rider revenue requirements and the resulting adjustment factors by customer class (Petition). Xcel's proposal would reduce the total revenue requirements from \$62.7 million for 2024 to \$57.5 million for 2025, and change the TCR Rider factors by category, as shown in Table 1 below, effective January 1, 2025.

Xcel proposed an implementation date of January 1, 2025, stating, using the beginning of the calendar year will simplify the rate change process, make the changes clearer to customers, and keep the TCR tracker balance more in-line with actual costs.² Xcel proposes to provisionally implement this TCR adjustment factor reduction if it is not possible for the full TCR rider petition to be approved by that time. The January 1, 2025 implementation date for the TCR Rider factors would coincide with the implementation of interim rates in Xcel's multi-year rate case in Docket No. E002/GR-24-320.

Having completed an initial review of Xcel's Petition, the Department believes full Department review and Commission approval is unlikely by January 1, 2025. Of note, this year's petition introduces new projects.³ Further, the Department does not want to delay implementation of the rate change given it is an overall reduction.

The Department therefore recommends the Commission approve Xcel's requested TCR Rider factors provisional rate reduction to be implemented on January 1, 2025, subject to future update.
