Dear Ms. Bergman:

Northern States Power Company, doing business as Xcel Energy, submits to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) these Comments pursuant to the Commission's March 20, 2026 Notice of Complete Application and Public Information Meetings (Notice)¹ in the above-referenced docket.

We appreciate the opportunity to provide comments in support of the Commission's consideration of the Northwest Maple Grove 115 kV Transmission Project (Project). The Project is needed to provide additional transmission capacity due to a significant increase in electric demand from new homes and businesses in the Twin Cities northwest suburbs, and to improve electric system reliability throughout the region. The Commission's Energy Infrastructure Permitting (EIP) staff reviewed the Route Permit Application² and found it complete under Minn. Stat. § 216I.05.³ Public information meetings were held in-person at the Maple Grove Community Center on April 14 and online on April 15, 2026. Written comments were accepted through April 27, 2026.

Here, we respond to comments from: (1) Chuck and Ann Latia, and Darrel Corazalla (Latia and Corazalla Comments);⁴ (2) JoAnna Gellerman (Gellerman Comments);⁵ (3) Paula Helgren (Helgren Comments)⁶ (4) the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT Comments);⁷ and (5) oral comments made during the public information meetings. Public commenters focused on six issues: (1) the proposed route, (2) viewshed and aesthetic impacts, (3) potential interference with radio and television, (4) impact on property values; (5) impacts to Rush Creek; and (6) transportation.⁸

COMMENTS

A. Route Alternative

The Latia and Corazalla Comments propose the same alternative route for the Project.⁹ The Comments explain that the route alternative “would begin at the east end of 105th Ave.” and “would continue south along what used to be ‘Ranchview’ to the ‘South Option Base,’ then continue west to the New West Maple Grove Substation.” The Helgren Comments also advocate for a southern route along Highway 610.¹⁰ As we discuss in more detail below, this route alternative would increase the total number of affected residents, increase environmental effects, and present challenges related to existing and planned development. **Attachment 1** shows two potential alignments for this route alternative.

Although both alignments of the route alternative present similar challenges, the alignment along Highway 610 (610 Route Alternative) presents greater operational challenges and impacts to existing and future development, whereas the alignment

partially along 101st Avenue North (101 Route Alternative) has greater environmental effects. Both alignments of the proposed alternative route are similar to routes Xcel Energy evaluated and rejected during the route-selection process: the South Option and South Interconnect Option (Southern Options).¹¹ The Commenters’ route alternative presents challenges similar to those that caused the Company to reject the Southern Options during the route-selection process. The Application discusses the reasons we rejected the Southern Options at Section 4.1.3.

First, the proposed alternative will increase the total number of affected residents. Either alignment of the route alternative would be partially located along Niagara Lane and the backside of about 22 townhomes. It would also be much closer to these residences than the residences affected by Xcel Energy’s proposed route, which extends west along 105th Avenue North. As shown in **Table 1**, both the 610 Route Alternative and 101 Route Alternative increase the number of residences within 500 feet of the centerline. The increase in number of residences impacted over the proposed route is most pronounced within 100 feet. Only one residence is within 100 feet of Xcel Energy’s proposed route, whereas 22-23 residences are within 100 feet of the route alternative.¹²

Second, the effects of the proposed alternative would increase as planned developments in the area proceed. As discussed in Sections 2.2.1.1, 4, and 4.1.4 of the Application, during route selection, Xcel Energy received feedback that the Southern Options would hinder development of at least two properties. The owner of the property at the northwest corner of 105th and Niagara Lane North indicated they were evaluating two proposals: one for development of approximately 131 mostly

detached residences and one for a 60,000-square-foot medical office building (Residential/Medical Office Development). The property owner raised concerns about the Southern Options' effect on the ability of the property to be developed for these purposes. Similarly, a development south and west of 105th and Niagara is entitled for a 42,000-square-foot medical building (Medical Building Development). During the route selection process, the developer of this Medical Building Development explained the Southern Options could significantly impair development of the property.¹³ Although the route alternative may have less impact on the Medical Building Development than the Southern Options, it would have the same impact on the Residential/Medical Office Development.

The 610 Route Alternative would present additional development-related challenges. The Helgren Comments stated that the City of Maple Grove (City) expressed a “desire to avoid proposed development which would have been the southern path along 610.”¹⁴ We are unfamiliar with any such position by the City. In fact, the Highway 610 corridor has already seen significant commercial development, and many of the remaining parcels have been slated for new development. During route selection, the City stated that a route along Highway 610 would interfere with development plans, including the Minnesota Health Village and associated road construction. Routing a transmission line through this highly developed area would be practically difficult given the short distances between the commercial properties and Highway 610. There are also reliability and risk-management issues with operating a critical transmission line along a major highway corridor, rather than a secondary two-lane road like 105th, given the difficulty of accessing the site.

The 101 Route Alternative avoids *some* of these development challenges along the Highway 610 corridor but presents new ones. The Project would need to cross private farmland north of 101st Avenue North, rather than entirely following existing corridors. This alignment would put the Project near at least one additional residence. The area north of 101st also has greater wetland impacts. The 101 Route Alternative would impact more than twice the area of wetlands as the proposed route. The wetland impacts of both alignments compared to the proposed route are provided in **Table 2**.

The impacts to forested wetland tend to be more significant than impacts to other types of wetland. Forested wetland within the right-of-way must be cleared of trees to accommodate the conductors, even if the no structures are placed within the wetland. Clearing of forested wetland is generally considered a permanent wetland impact because there is a permanent change in type of wetland even if they can be spanned. The Company’s proposed route impacts no forested wetland, whereas the route alternative would permanently impact 0.3 acres of forested wetland.

Third, either alignment of the route alternative presents significant engineering challenges in spanning MnDOT’s recently completed highway interchange connecting I-94, Highway 610, and Rush Creek Boulevard. A southern route would require crossing this triple-interchange with significant elevation increases. An approximately 200-foot steel pole with davit arms—significantly taller than typical structures for this Project—would be required to span the 600-1,000 foot distance across the interchange. If the 101 Route Alternative were selected, a tower would likely need to be placed in a wetland. By contrast, the Company’s proposed route selects the narrowest feasible crossing point for I-94.

Because a southern alignment would have greater human and environmental effects, and presents significant engineering challenges, it does not appear to warrant further evaluation.

B. Aesthetic Impacts

Commenters during the public information meeting raised concerns about potential aesthetic impacts of the Project. Aesthetic impacts of the Project are discussed in Section 7.3.4 of the Application. The Project’s viewshed is located in mixed use and agricultural land neighboring I-94.¹⁵ The route follows existing corridors for most of its length. Along 105th, the route will be on the opposite side of the right-of-way

from most residences, mitigating visual impacts to those homes. For these reasons, overall aesthetic impacts of the Project are anticipated to be minimal, though they may be more acute for those within the Project's immediate viewshed.¹⁶

Xcel Energy carefully consults with all individuals and entities that may have a legal interest in the identified property where a new or expanded right-of-way and related transmission structure is needed. A right-of-way agent will consult with each property owner about the best location to place a transmission tower that must be built on their property. The Second Latia Comments expressed a preference to have any tower located on the east or west side of their house. No pole is currently planned to be located on the Latias' property. Based on anticipated pole placements, any pole would be across 105th from the Latias' property. We are more than willing to take feedback on pole placement from adjacent property owners. But we will also have to account for the desires of the landowner where the structure is located, as well as engineering constraints.

C. Electronic Interference

The Latia and Corazalla Comments expressed concerns about interference with electronic devices, including AM radio and television reception.¹⁷ The Project's potential to interfere with reception of radio, television, cellular, and Global Positioning System signals is discussed in Section 7.3.11 of the Application.¹⁸ Electronic interference from transmission lines can impact electronic communications like radios, television, and microwave communications through a shadowing effect. Shadowing can occur when communication signals are physically blocked by a transmission line structure (line-of-sight interference).

Interference with television signals is uncommon because television-broadcast frequencies are generally high enough to avoid corona-generated-noise effects. The use of shielded coaxial cable for cable television transmissions generally makes them insusceptible to interference from electromagnetic noise. Although television interference is rare, it can happen when a structure is aligned between a receiver and a weak, distant signal. Interference could occur if the device was located immediately adjacent to a tower structure, blocking its signal. Moreover, digital and satellite television transmissions can be affected by multi-path reflections (shadowing) generated by nearby towers. This occurs when radio signals bounce off obstacles and arrive at a receiver via multiple paths, interfering with the direct signal.

Electronic interference dissipates rapidly the farther the device is from the transmission line. Interference with electronic devices can be mitigated by prudent structure placement or with the movement of the receiver. Given that the proposed route is more than 100 feet from all but one residence, interference with radio is not anticipated. If the Project causes interference with electronic devices, we are committed to taking the actions necessary to restore reception.

D. Property Values

Concerns were also raised about the Project's impact on property values. The impact of transmission lines on property values is discussed in greater detail in Section 7.3.6 and Appendix H of the Application. Changes to a specific property's value are difficult to predict. Studies show that impacts to property values tend to lessen as the size of the impacted property increases. Research also shows that, if impacts to property values occur, they typically range from 3 to 6 percent.¹⁹ The general consensus of recent literature concludes that transmission lines have little, if any, impact on the property values of agricultural land. The observed impacts of transmission lines on agricultural property values have, over time, reduced to near zero as adaptations have been made to transmission lines to reduce the impacts on agricultural production. Across all types of property, property value impacts decrease with distance from transmission lines, with no impacts typically observed between 200 feet and 1 mile. Impacts on property values also tend to diminish over time. Although impacts may be unavoidable with necessary energy infrastructure projects, our goal is always to minimize impacts as best as practicable. The impacts of the Project, including on property values, can be minimized by selecting the route proposed in the Application, which affects fewer residences and businesses than a southern route alternative.

E. Rush Creek

The Gellerman Comments also noted impacts on Rush Creek²⁰ may be a concern. The impacts of the Project on surface water bodies, including Rush Creek, are discussed in Section 7.7.5.9 of the Application. The Project will require no in-water work or structures to be placed in Rush Creek. Rush Creek could see minimum impacts as a result of the Project. Specifically, construction could cause sedimentation to Rush Creek due to disturbance of surrounding land by excavation, grading, construction traffic, and dewatering holes drilled for transmission structures. These

impacts will be avoided or minimized through implementation of sediment-control practices detailed in the Minnesota Construction Stormwater Permit and the Project-specific Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan. There will be negligible effects on Rush Creek during operation because disturbed soil will be restored to previous conditions or better, and the amount of land area converted to an impervious service would be limited. The Company will maintain sound water and soil conservation practices during operation to protect topsoil adjacent to Rush Creek.

F. Transportation

The MnDOT Comments address a number of topics, including impacts to a Regional Transportation Management Center (RTMC)/Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) facility and co-location of the Project with I-94 and Highway 610. As requested by MnDOT, we are committed to ongoing communication regarding any adjustments to the alignment or route width within the area of the RTMC/ITS facility. We will also continue to collaborate with RTMC/ITS staff regarding pole placement, construction access, and conductor stringing to avoid interference with fiber, cameras, detection systems, and power feeds. The Company also confirms it will be respectful of trunk highway clear zones, bridge safety buffers, intersection sightlines, and future MnDOT corridor use. We will also continue to coordinate with MnDOT regarding seed requirements and herbicide restrictions, including in areas designated as MnDOT “vegetation of concern” and Monarch Candidate Conservation Agreement with Assurances Adopted Acres. Finally, the Company recognizes, and will honor, MnDOT’s request for “ongoing coordination on contaminated materials screening, noxious weed management, wetland considerations, and proper handling of any activities within MnDOT ROW.”

CONCLUSION

We appreciate the public’s input on our Application for this important Project that is needed to address the significant increase in electric demand from new homes and businesses in the Twin Cities northwest suburbs, and to improve electric system reliability throughout the region. We look forward to continued engagement with stakeholders and the Commission regarding the Project.

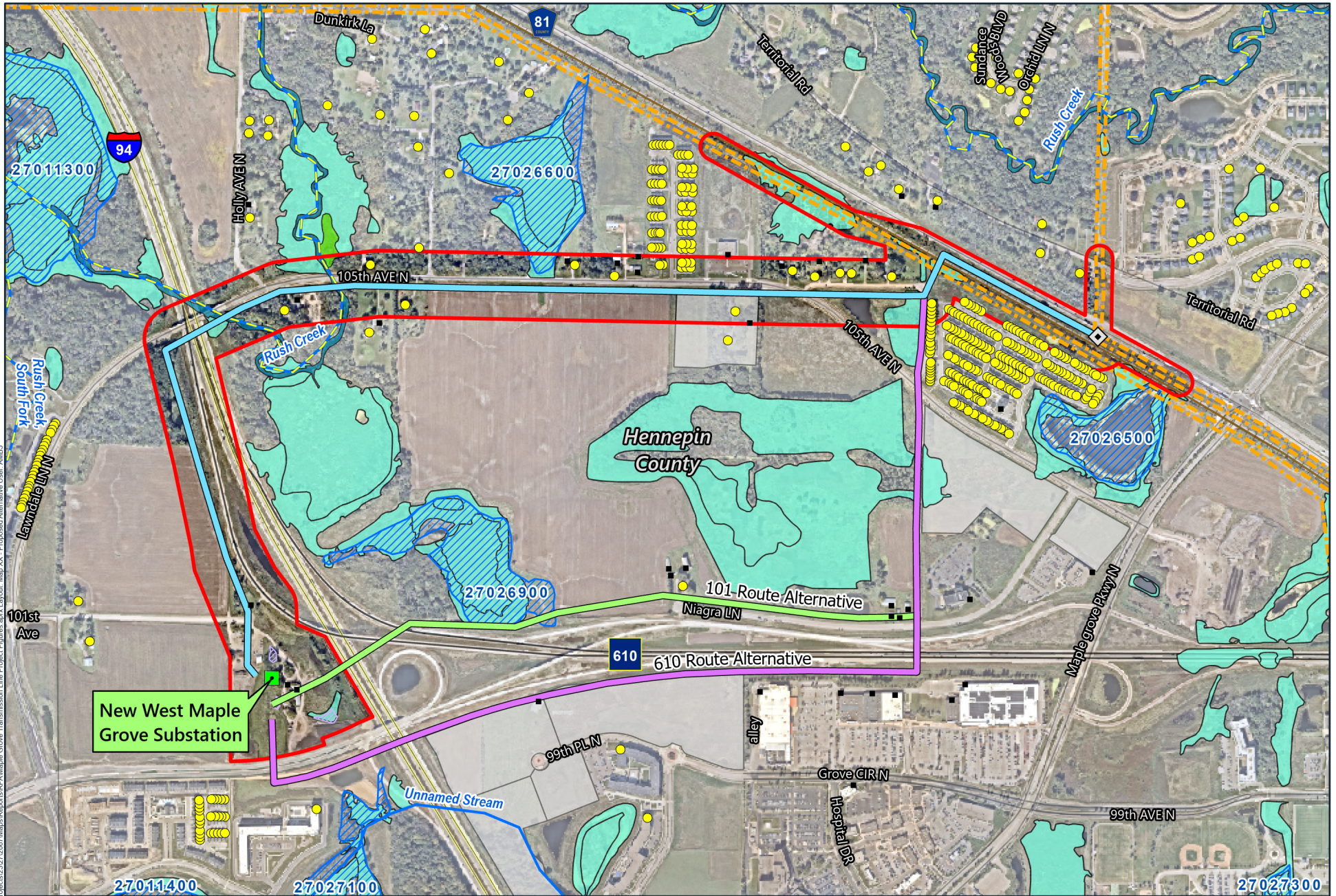

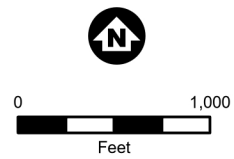
