NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS AND AVAILABILITY OF ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

Issued: April 7th, 2025

In the Matter of the Application of Dairyland Power Cooperative for a Route Permit for the Beaver Creek 161-kV Transmission Line in Fillmore County, Minnesota

PUC Docket Number: ET3/TL-24-95 **OAH Docket Number:** 23-2500-40403

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) will hold public hearings on Dairyland Power Cooperative's (Dairyland) application for a route permit for the Beaver Creek Transmission Line Project.

The proposed project will be new construction of an approximately 3.5-mile 161 kilovolt (kV) high voltage transmission line and associated facilities. The applicant is requesting a 500-footwide proposed route, with some portions consisting of a 1,320-foot-wide route to accommodate existing buildings and features. The right of way will be 100-110 ft (50-55ft on either side of the centerline) depending on the road right of way it is paralleling.

The proposed project will start at the intersection of the existing 161 kV LQ8A Harmony to Beaver Creek transmission line and 171st Avenue in York Township in Fillmore County, Minnesota, travel south and cross the Minnesota-Iowa border at the southern border of York Township, continue westerly and southerly through Howard County, Iowa and terminate at a new proposed 161 kV switchyard to be constructed in Chester Township, Howard County, Iowa. The Minnesota portion of the proposed project will be approximately 3.5 miles long and will be located entirely in York Township in Fillmore County, Minnesota.

Dairyland will use single-pole steel structures, with pole heights ranging from 75 to 140 feet above ground and spans between structures from 300 to 1,000 feet. The proposed project is colocated with other road or utility rights-of-way for the entirety of its length. MiEnergy, a distribution cooperative serving members in the area, has existing overhead distribution lines within the proposed route. Dairyland plans to coordinate with MiEnergy about burying these lines where they are overtaken by the proposed project, rather than under build them on the new 161 kV structures.

Public Hearing Information

The public hearings will be presided over by the Honorable Suzanne Todnem, an administrative law judge from the Office of Administrative Hearings, who will provide the Commission with findings of fact, conclusions of law, and a recommendation.

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The purpose of public hearings is to obtain public input on the proposed project and compile the record for Commission consideration in making a final decision on the route permit application. Specifically, interested persons will have an opportunity to: (1) ask questions of state staff and the applicant; (2) offer oral and written comments on the merits of the project and on the environmental assessment; and (3) suggest possible conditions to be considered for inclusion in the route permit.

- Comments received at the hearings and during the comment period will be used to inform the record and help the Commission make its final decision.
- The information presented will be the same at all in-person and online hearings.
- The hearings will end when all attendees have had the opportunity to comment and all other business has been concluded, or the scheduled end time of the hearing, whichever occurs first.
- Members of the public may participate without the necessity of intervening as a party;
 representation by legal counsel is permitted but not required.

Comment Period

Written comments will be accepted through **May 13, 2025, by 4:30 p.m.** Please include the docket number (24-95) in all communications. Comments received after the close of the comment period may or may not be considered by the Commission.

Topics for Comment

- Should the Commission grant a route permit for the proposed project?
- If granted, what additional conditions or requirements, if any, should be included in the route permit?


