That being said, I would like to amend our Petition Letter. 1st paragraph 2nd line currently reads - (This affects us all as farm families and area residents) After this sentence I would like to add (We the signers of this Petition Formally ask that a Task Force Committee be assigned to this Project as well as new and updated studies be conducted on all Items in this Petition.) If the PUC doesn't feel this would be a correct thing to grant as we are changing language that has already been signed, then I would ask to be allowed 10 days to amend the Petition and have it re-signed by residents and resubmitted to the PUC. 10 day period would start when we had confirmation from the PUC that it was allowed.

I personally do not see either option as a big ask at all as Ranger Power/ Lemon Hills asked for PUC permit approval before public comment closes or there have been any hearings. RE: Formal Objection to the Lemon Hill Solar Project - Legal, Environmental, and Public Health Risks

Dear Commissioners,

As a resident of southeastern Minnesota, I am writing to formally object to the proposed Lemon Hill Solar Project. This project raises grave legal, environmental, and public health concerns that I believe the Commission must take seriously.

This project would install thousands of cadmium telluride solar panels over highly fractured bedrock and shallow karst aquifers-conditions that significantly increase the risk of groundwater contamination. Southeastern Minnesota's unique geology makes our drinking water especially vulnerable to any surface-level pollutants or leaks. Once toxic materials penetrate this landscape, they can move rapidly through subterranean fissures and contaminate wells, streams, and drinking water supplies across large distances.

Moreover, the manufacturer's own data classifies cadmium telluride as hazardous. The Minnesota Department of Health and the MPCA have both raised warnings about the risks posed by toxic substances in the karst region. Despite this, no independent third-party hydrogeologic or toxicological studies have been conducted at

the Lemon Hill site. This lack of due diligence puts public health, property values, and environmental integrity at risk.

Addendum: The 3M PFAS Groundwater Contamination Case - Legal and Environmental Implications for the Lemon Hill Solar Project

As a critical supplement to my objection, I urge the Commission to consider the recent landmark settlement between 3M Company and the United States over widespread groundwater contamination caused by per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), also known as "forever chemicals."

In 2023, 3M agreed to pay \$10.3 billion to resolve claims from public water suppliers across the country. This litigation stemmed from the company's decades-long discharge of toxic PFAS compounds-chemicals that are highly persistent in the environment and extremely mobile in groundwater systems. Like Viola Township and the surrounding areas, many of the affected regions contained karst terrain and shallow aquifers, which allowed PFAS to rapidly infiltrate drinking water sources.

This historic case highlights three urgent realities:

- 1. Groundwater contamination is often irreversible. Once toxic compounds enter fractured karst bedrock, they can travel for miles within hours and persist for decades.
- 2. The financial consequences of environmental negligence are staggering. The \$10 billion settlement-one of the largest of its kind-underscores the extraordinary liabilities facing both corporations and public agencies that ignore well-documented scientific risks.
- 3. Regulatory inaction can lead to lawsuits. Courts have shown a willingness to hold permitting authorities accountable when oversight fails.

The Lemon Hill Solar Project proposes to install cadmium telluride solar panels-classified as hazardous

materials-above one of Minnesota's most hydrogeologically sensitive areas. The 3M case illustrates how even

cutting-edge technologies can have devastating consequences when introduced into fragile ecosystems without

stringent safeguards.

Your decision on this project is not just procedural-it will set a lasting precedent. I urge the Commission to

reflect on the lessons of the 3M litigation and take meaningful, protective action to prevent a future

environmental crisis.

It is also critical to recognize the close proximity of the world-renowned Mayo Clinic in Rochester, located just a few miles from Viola Township. As one of the foremost medical institutions in the world, Mayo Clinic treats patients from across the globe and plays a vital role in public health, medical research, and emergency preparedness. The integrity of the region's groundwater is essential not only for local residents but also for the broader healthcare infrastructure. A catastrophic contamination event—such as the potential leaching of cadmium telluride into the aquifers—could severely impact Mayo Clinic's water sources, laboratory facilities, and overall operations. The reputational, public health, and economic consequences of such an outcome would be profound and far-reaching.



how do we get zoning lows charged. So we have choice.






