Project Description

Marshall Solar, LLC (Marshall Solar) proposes to build a 62.25 megawatt (MW) solar energy facility on approximately 500 acres in Stanley Township, about four miles east of Marshall, in Lyon County.

Meeting Information

- State agency staff will run the meeting.
- Public Utilities Commission, Department of Commerce, and Marshall Solar staff will be available to answer questions about the permitting process and the project.
- People will be able to offer oral comments, written comments, or both into the record.
- Comments received at the meeting and during the comment period will be used to develop the environmental assessment for this project.

Submit Comments

Topics Open for Public Comment:

- What potential human and environmental impacts of the proposed solar generation project should be studied in the environmental assessment?
 - Are there any specific methods or potential changes to the proposed project that may serve to avoid, minimize or mitigate potential impacts that should be studied in the environmental assessment?
 - Are there specific alternative sites that should be addressed in the environmental assessment? In proposing an alternative site, please bear in mind that Marshall Solar does not have the power of eminent domain, there must be a landowner willing to sell or lease a site that meets the project requirements. In addition, alternative sites should be of similar size to the proposed site, relatively flat and open with unimpeded views of the sun.
- Department of Commerce staff will also review the ability of any proposed alternative to interconnect to the transmission/distribution system.

Important Comments will be made available to the public via the Public Utilities Commission's and the Department of Commerce's websites, except in limited circumstances consistent with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act. Personally identifying information is not edited or deleted from submissions.

Process Information

Before the project can be built, the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) must approve a site permit. The Commission accepted Marshall Solar's site permit application at an April 2015 meeting. This means the company submitted all the information required to begin the review process. The Commission's decision-making process takes about six to nine months.

Department of Commerce Energy Environmental Review and Analysis staff will prepare an environmental assessment for this project. The environmental assessment will review the potential human and environmental impacts of the proposed project and alternatives, as well as ways to address impacts.

After the environmental assessment is issued, there will be a public hearing. An Administrative Law Judge will preside over the public hearing. People will be able to speak at the hearing, ask questions, and submit comments about the project.

After the public hearing, the Commission will review all the information in the record, including written comments and comments received at the public hearings. The Commission will schedule a meeting to make a final decision on the site permit for this project, expected by January 2016.

Eminent Domain: If issued a site permit by the Commission, Marshall Solar will not have the power of eminent domain to take land for this project.

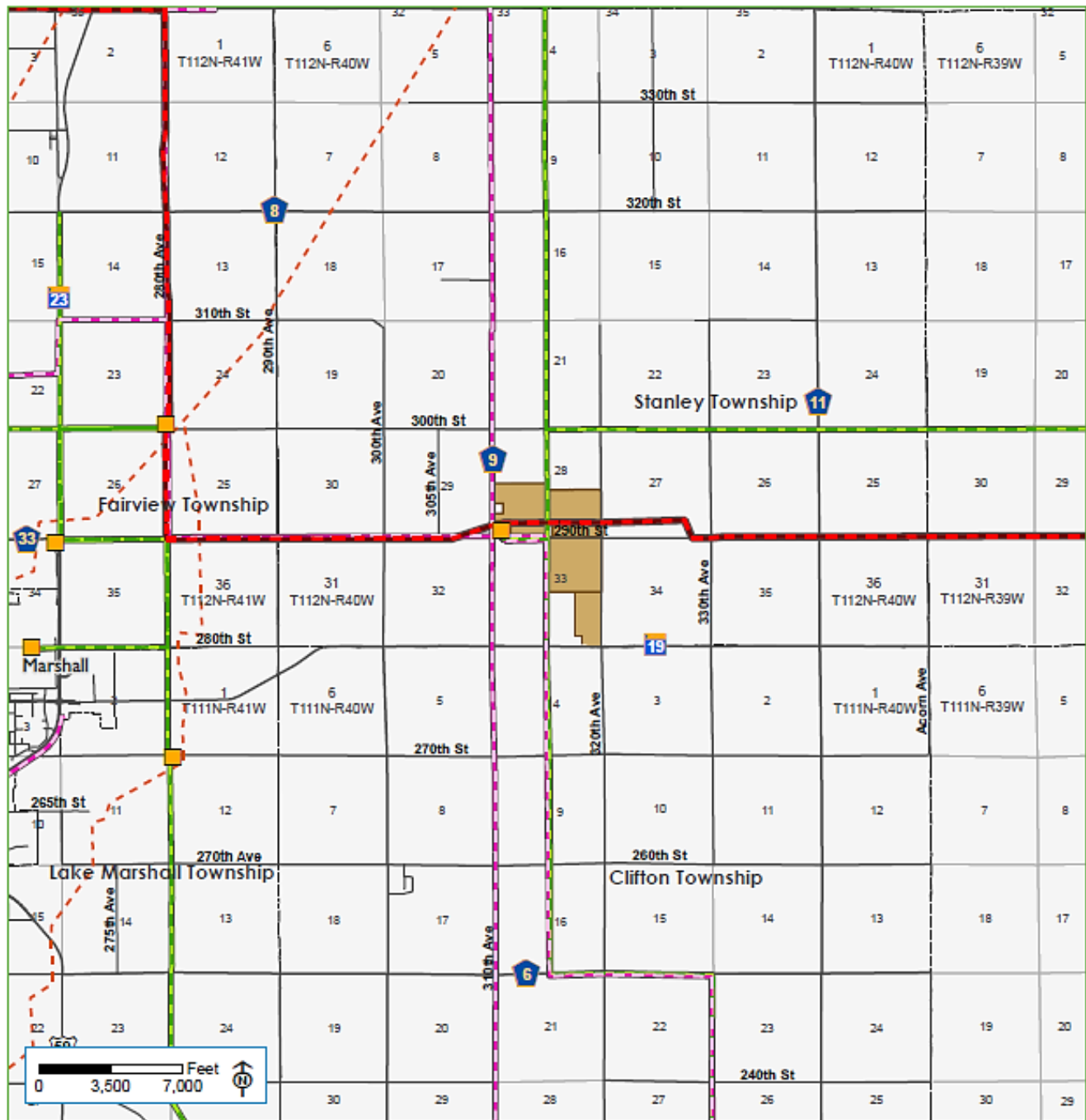
