Nobles 2 Power Partners, LLC (N2PP) requests your formal comments regarding our plans to obtain a site permit from the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (PUC) for the 250-300 MW Nobles 2 Wind Farm (Project). N2PP would also like to thank you for taking the time review the draft Site Characterization Study of the Project and meeting with us on February 29, 2016 to discuss Nobles 2. As indicated, we plan to apply for a Site Permit and Certificate of Need from the PUC in spring 2016.

N2PP proposes to construct the Project in Nobles County in southwestern Minnesota (**Exhibit 1**). The overall "Project Area" is located in the Townships, Ranges, and Sections indicated in the table below.

Consistent with PUC objectives, N2PP is committed to designing the Project in an orderly manner compatible with environmental preservation, sustainable development, and the efficient use of resources. All decisions with respect to equipment selection, site layout, and spacing are designed to make the most efficient use of land and wind resources while minimizing environmental impacts to the extent practicable. The turbine selected for the Project will be dependent on the most appropriate technology available at the time of ordering equipment prior to construction.

The Project will consist of approximately 150 wind turbines, access roads, underground collection lines, step up transformers, permanent meteorological tower(s), and step up substation. As noted in our discussions, several existing wind farms are in the area of the Project including Nobles (200 MW) and Community Wind South (30 MW) south of the Project Area, Fenton Wind Power Plant (205.5 MW) and Stoneray (not yet constructed) northwest of the Project Area, and Prairie Rose Wind (200 MW) approximately 10 miles west of the Project Area.

N2PP has engaged Westwood Professional Services to complete initial studies and permitting for the Project. As indicated in N2PP's draft Site Characterization Study, the Project Area is primarily comprised of cultivated agricultural land. The predominance of agricultural land, lack of suitable habitat for sensitive species, and pre-and post-construction avian and bat survey information from surrounding wind farms and other farms located in southern Minnesota indicates the Project will be a low risk to avian and bat species. Nonetheless, in an effort to verify the low-risk characterization, general avian point count and eagle point count surveys were initiated in January 2016. As a result of our recent agency discussions regarding avian and bat surveys for the Project, Westwood has adjusted the frequency of eagle point count surveys to include sampling twice per month in March and April and October and November to better capture the peak migration period for bald eagles. Raptor nest surveys, including bald eagles, will be initiated in the next week and grassland and riparian bird surveys are expected to be initiated in mid-May.

N2PP requests your formal comments of the Project for potential environmental impacts and would appreciate any recommendations you may have regarding potential impacts to species of concern.



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


