


Dear Customer:

As you know, Madelia Municipal Light & Power (MMLP) is currently providing you construction electric service. This letter provides notice that MMLP and South Central Electric Association have filed a joint request to formally update the electric service maps on file with the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (MPUC) to reflect MMLP as the electric service provider where you are located. This letter provides information concerning that proceeding before the MPUC.

The MPUC is a state agency with jurisdiction over electric service territory boundaries. The MPUC requires that all customers located in an area involved in a change in the service territory maps be formally notified of the proceeding in which the service territory maps will be approved. This letter provides that formal notice.
