Attached are the Comments on the petition of the Minnesota Department of Commerce (Department) in the following matter:

Petition to Order Discontinuance of Service to Revoked Carriers and Carriers that have Relinquished their Certificates of Authority

The Department recommends the following action of the Commission:

- 1) Order all local exchange and interexchange carriers to discontinue service arrangements enabling the list of identified carriers to provide Minnesota intrastate telecommunications services to enduser and wholesale customers.
- 2) Order carriers who find that end-user or wholesale customers will be affected by the discontinuance to contact the Department within 7 days of the date of the Commission's Order. The Department will notify the carrier within 3 business days if the discontinuance may proceed, if there must first be a transition plan approved by the Department, or if the matter is to be further addressed by the Commission prior to discontinuance.
- 3) Order all local exchange and interexchange carriers to not engage in any new service arrangements for the provision of services that enable the identified carriers to provide Minnesota intrastate telecommunications service to end-user or wholesale customers effective immediately, unless this Order is suspended by another Commission Order.
- 4) In executing the directives of the Order, carriers are NOT to disconnect service arrangements that are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction, such as commercial agreements used for the provision of wireless or Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) services.

# **Comments of the Minnesota Department of Commerce**

IN THE MATTER OF THE ORDER OF DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE TO REVOKED CARRIERS AND CARRIERS THAT HAVE RELINQUISHED THEIR CERTIFICATES OF AUTHORITY

Docket No. P999/M-22-224

#### I. BACKGROUND

For all revocation and relinquishment dockets, the Department includes a note that, in the future, it intends to petition the Commission to require that all carriers discontinue their services to the carrier pursuant to Minn. Stat. 237.121 (a)(6). For administrative efficiency, this petition is filed at a future time with all carriers that have recently relinquished their authority or have recently had their authority revoked.

The most recent Order for discontinuance of service to carriers, who relinquished their certification or had their certification revoked, was issued on January 6, 2021 in Docket No. P999/M-19-815.

Since the last Order, the certificates of authority for the following carriers have been cancelled:

## II. PROCEDURE

To ensure that the Commission's cancellation orders are enforced, and that all certificated carriers are aware of the cancellation of these certificates of authority, the Commission may order all local exchange and interexchange carriers to discontinue providing those services that enable the revoked carrier to continue providing service in violation of Chapter 237.

Under Minn. Stat. §237.121(a)(6), a telephone company or telecommunications carrier is prohibited from providing telephone service to a person acting as a telephone company or telecommunications carrier if the Commission has ordered the carrier to discontinue service to that person. This requirement does not apply to customers that use an "over-the-top" phone service from a provider that is unaffiliated with the provider of the customer's internet service.

In the event the identified carriers have continued to provide telecommunications service to end users after the Commission has cancelled their authority, end user or wholesale customers may lose service if their underlying service is discontinued by the revoked carrier. Therefore, all carriers that are the subject of the instant order should also be required to develop a plan in consultation with the Department if discontinuance of service to the revoked carrier would result in disconnection of telecommunications service to end user or wholesale customers. The plan may include methods for notifying the carrier to be disconnected and any affected end users of the discontinuance, as well as any other outstanding issues either the carrier or the Department identify. Similarly, Minn. Stat. §237.121(a) (6) precludes new service arrangements with carriers that are subject to a Commission discontinuance of service order.

## III. RECOMMENDATION

The Department recommends that the Commission take the following action:

- 1) Order all local exchange and interexchange carriers to discontinue service arrangements enabling the list of identified carriers to provide Minnesota intrastate telecommunications services to end-user and wholesale customers.
- 2) Order carriers who find end-user or wholesale customers, who will be affected by the discontinuance, to contact the Department within 7 days of the date of the Commission's Order in the current docket. The Department will notify the carrier within 3 business days if the discontinuance may proceed, if there must first be a transition plan approved by the Department, or if the matter is to be further addressed by the Commission prior to discontinuance.
- 3) Order all local exchange and interexchange carriers to not engage in any new service arrangements for the provision of services that enable the identified carriers to provide Minnesota intrastate telecommunications service to end-user or wholesale customers effective immediately, unless this Order is suspended by another Commission Order.
- 4) In executing the directives of the Order, carriers are NOT to disconnect service arrangements that are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction, such as commercial agreements used for the provision of wireless or Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) services.
