Dear Mr. Seuffert and Judge Case:

Byron Solar, LLC ("Byron Solar") submits these comments in response to the oral public comments made at the in-person and virtual public hearings held on November 9 and 10, 2022, respectively, on Byron Solar's proposed up to 200 megawatt ("MW") photovoltaic solar energy generating facility and associated systems ("Solar Facility") and 345 kilovolt ("kV") high voltage transmission line and associated facilities ("Transmission Line") in Olmsted and Dodge Counties, Minnesota (the "Project"). Byron Solar will respond to written comments submitted during the comment period ending November 29, 2022 through a separate filing by December 9, 2022 in accordance with the schedule established for these proceedings.

I. Response to Comments Regarding Blue vs Red Routes.

Several public comments focused on Byron Solar's proposed route (the "Blue Route") and the alternative route (the "Red Route"). A few commenters suggested that economic reasons were the primary factors weighing in favor of the Blue Route over the Red Route, but Byron Solar notes that the record demonstrates the numerous non-economic reasons why the Blue Route is superior to the Red Route. For example:

• The Red Route would require construction of more infrastructure, resulting in increased environmental and human impacts – namely, the Red Route would be approximately 4.5 miles long (as compared to the Blue Route's three-mile length) and the associated

alternative substation location would require over three miles of additional collection line length.¹

- The Red Route would require more tree clearing. By contrast, the Blue Route is designed to avoid tree clearing to the greatest extent practicable, and the corridor does not contain significant trees, shrubs, or other vegetation that will be impacted during construction.²
- The Red Route crosses more wetland areas (4.7 acres), while the Blue Route only crosses approximately 0.7 wetland acres.³
- The Red Route could result in increased geologic and groundwater impacts. Due to the Red Route's proximity to identified active karst features, construction of the alternate substation location and transmission structures in the southern-most area of the Red Route has an increased potential for groundwater contamination.⁴
- The Red Route is located closer to the nearest residence (250 feet).⁵

Additionally, the Blue Route was voluntarily negotiated with landowners, and Byron Solar has secured 100 percent of the total necessary private easements from landowners for the 52.7 acres of right-of-way required for the Blue Route. By contrast, Byron Solar does not have land rights to construct the Red Route, and it is not guaranteed that Byron Solar would be able to secure the additional leases. In fact, based on conversations with landowners along the Red Route, it seems unlikely that Byron Solar could obtain voluntary land rights necessary to construct along the Red Route.

In developing the Blue Route, Byron Solar undertook to analyze a number of human and environmental factors to identify a route that best meets the Commission's routing criteria, including following existing rights-of-way for approximately 35 percent of its length.⁶ The Blue Route is also designed to avoid or minimize impacts on residences, the environment, and other sensitive resources. Further, the Blue Route takes into consideration comments and requests from individual landowners. No adverse comments from landowners along the Blue Route have been received.

Overall, the Red Route (and associated alternative substation location) presents no specific benefits as compared to the Blue Route and would result in greater human and environmental impacts.

II. Response to Comments Regarding Dodge County Performance Standards.

Comments were made during the public hearings regarding the Dodge County Ordinance performance standards for solar energy farms (40 kW or greater) and transmission lines, which are authorized as conditional uses under the Ordinance. However, the Dodge County Ordinance applies to solar energy systems and transmission lines that are not otherwise subject to siting and oversight by the Commission under the Power Plant Siting Act (Minnesota Statute Ch. 216E). Pursuant to Minnesota Statute § 216E.10, subdivision 1, the site permit and route permit issued by the Commission are the only site approvals required for construction of the Solar Facility and Transmission Line. While the Commission will take local land use into consideration as part of its application review, the site or route permit issued by the Commission supersedes and preempts all zoning requirements or land use rules at the county and local level.

Although the Ordinance does not apply because the Project requires a route permit and site permit from the Commission, which supersedes and preempts all zoning ordinances authorized by the County, there are also numerous reasons why application of performance standards designed for much smaller solar systems are not feasible or practical to apply to a utility-scale project. As shown in the attached <u>Table 1</u>, Byron Solar has considered the Dodge County setbacks when designing the Project and has committed to meeting the County's setbacks where feasible.

III. Response to Comments Regarding Fence.

At the public hearings, members of the public raised questions regarding the location of the Project fence in relation to property lines. Byron Solar responded that the fence will not be located on property lines – rather, it will be wholly located on the participating parcel and will be set back from the property line.

At the virtual public hearing, John Wagner, who owns land adjacent to the Solar Facility, raised questions regarding the location of the Project fence and stormwater pond in relation to his property line. Byron Solar responded during the hearing that the fence would be set back from Mr. Wagner's property line, and the fence and stormwater pond would be wholly located on land under lease for the Project. Byron Solar also followed up with Mr. Wagner after the public hearing and answered his questions regarding facility placement. As noted during the public hearings, Byron Solar will continue to coordinate with landowners.

IV. Response to Comments Regarding Coordination With Local Officials.

County and township representatives spoke during the in-person public hearing. Byron Solar appreciates their participation and will continue to coordinate with the counties and townships, including regarding drainage and infrastructure/road crossings.

V. Conclusion.

Byron Solar appreciates the opportunity to provide these reply comments to comments made during the public hearings. As noted above, Byron Solar will respond to the written comments submitted during the comment period by December 9, 2022.
