Developers of a wind powered electrical generation facility in Sibley County are preparing an application for a United States Department of Agriculture grant in response to a formal Notice of Funds Availability (NOFA) inviting applications for the USDA Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements Grant Program. One of the requirements in this grant process is an environmental review which seeks information regarding impacts on wildlife and endangered species. Specifically, in the instructions for preparing a Form RD 1940-20 (page 4), the applicants are asked to provide specific information regarding wildlife resources. As requested, the Minnesota Natural Heritage Information System has been queried to determine if any rare species or other significant natural features are known to occur within an approximate one-mile radius of the proposed project. Based on this query, there are no known occurrences of rare features in the area searched.

The Natural Heritage Information System (NHIS), a collection of databases that contain information about Minnesota's rare natural features, is maintained by the Division of Ecological Resources, Department of Natural Resources. The NHIS is continually updated as new information becomes available, and is the most complete source of data on Minnesota's rare or otherwise significant species, native plant communities, and other natural features. However, the NHIS is not an exhaustive inventory and thus does not represent all of the occurrences of rare features within the state. Therefore, ecologically significant features for which we have no records may exist on the project area.

Please be aware that this letter focuses only on potential effects to *rare natural features*; there may be other natural resource concerns associated with the proposed project. This letter does not constitute review or approval by the Department of Natural Resources as a whole. If you would like further information on the environmental review process, please contact your Regional Environmental Assessment Ecologist, Todd Kolander, at (507) 359-6073.





Thanks again for talking with the FWS today about the Sibley Wind project. Attached is the map I generated of the Sibley Wind project and the 10-mile buffer. I delineated the project footprint as the minimum convex hull around the turbines, which is what the FWS delineates as the project footprint in the Eagle Conservation Plan Guidance. As we stated on the phone call, the lack of any bald eagle records could be either a product of a genuine lack of eagle nests in the area, or a lack of data coverage in that area of the state.

With regard to the citizen letter about bird records in the project site - I reviewed my emails and determined that the letter I had been sent was a draft copy and has not yet been submitted to the PUC. The citizens who wrote the letter are planning on submitting it in a few days - at that time I can send you the copy.








