Information to be Included in Peoples' Response:

- 1. Are the statements set out in the Request for Dispute Resolution accurate?
- 2. Provide copies of the 2014 and 2015 reports filed with the Commission required under Minn. Rules 7835.0300-1100. If not included in those reports or if the reports were not filed, please include all the information outlined in Schedules A through H of the rules.
- 3. To the extent not included in the answer to #1 above, provide all rate and tariff sheets and all written policies and procedures applicable to cogeneration and small power production facilities and customers that were in effect within the last 12 months, including those currently in effect.
- 4. Provide copies of any information given to members within the last 12 months through bill inserts, newsletters, the cooperative's website, or other means about the additional facilities fee.
- 5. Address any additional issues relevant to the Commission's resolution of this dispute.

Topic/s Open for Comment:

- Is the imposition of an additional monthly fee on distributed generation accounts prohibited under Minn. Stat. §216B.164, subd. 3(a) and/or Minn. Rules, Part 7835.3000?
- Is imposition of the fee prohibited, allowed, or otherwise affected by: any other Minnesota statute or rule, order of the Commission, the federal Public Utilities Regulatory Policy Act (PURPA), or federal rules adopted to implement PURPA?
- Address any other issues relevant to the Commission's resolution of this dispute.

Project Background: On March 11, 2015, a member of Peoples' Energy Cooperative (Peoples) filed a request with the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) for a resolution of a dispute relating to Peoples' imposition of an additional \$5.00 fee monthly fee on his account because he has an interconnected small wind facility. The member contends that imposition of such a fee on his account, and on all other distributed generation accounts, violates Minnesota statutes and rules with respect to cogeneration and small power production, including but not limited to Minn. Stat. §216B.164, subd. 3(a).

Minn. Stat. §216B.164, subd. 5 and Minnesota Rules, Part 7835.4500, provide that in the case of a dispute between a utility and a qualifying facility, either party may request the Commission to determine the issue; the burden of proof is on the utility.

Filing Requirements: Utilities, telecommunications carriers, official parties, and state agencies are **required** to file documents using the Commission's electronic filing system (eFiling). All parties, participants and interested persons are encouraged to use eFiling: mn.gov/puc, select *eFiling*, and follow the prompts.
