Topics Open for Comment:

- Does the Commission have jurisdiction over this matter?
- Are there reasonable grounds to investigate the allegations? Please include a discussion of Minn. Stat. § 216B.17 in your comments.
- If the Commission decides to investigate the complaint, what procedure should be followed to carry out the investigation, given the large number of claimed tariff violations? For example, could the issues raised by the complaint be addressed as part of a contested case proceeding in Docket No. E-002/M-13-867, through direction to the Department of Commerce or some other entity to investigate the potential violations, or within the scope of grid modernization?
- How will an investigation of the allegations be coordinated with the process established in the Commission's August 6, 2015 Order (in Docket No. E-002/M-13-867) to investigate interconnection disputes?
- How will the timing of an investigation be coordinated with other filings already pending in the Community Solar Garden Docket No. E-002/M-13-867?

Project Background: On August 28, 2015, SunShare, LLC (SunShare) filed a Formal Complaint and Petition for Relief under Minn. Stat. § 216B.1641 and Sections 9 and 10 of Xcel Energy's tariff book. The Complaint and Petition alleges 100 discrete tariff violations committed by Xcel Energy under the Solar*Rewards Community (S*RC) program in Minnesota. SunShare is seeking an expedited proceeding to provide the relief requested.

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Filing Requirements: Utilities, telecommunications carriers, official parties, and state agencies are **required** to file documents using the Commission's electronic filing system (eFiling). All parties, participants and interested persons are encouraged to use eFiling: <u>mn.gov/puc</u>, select *eFiling*, and follow the prompts.
