Dear Mr. Wolf:

Northern States Power Company, doing business as Xcel Energy, submits to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission this brief Reply in response to the December 29, 2016 Comments of the Minnesota Department of Commerce in the above-referenced docket.

We appreciate the Department's review and recommendation that the Commission approve our proposed 2017 capital structure, and accept the recommendations outlined on pages 18-19 of the Comments.

In Comments, the Department also requested the Company provide an update regarding its efforts to dissolve the Nuclear Management Corporation (NMC). We have completed a diligence process that was necessary to determine whether there could be any unknown or unintended consequences for NSP Nuclear Corporation and/or the NSPM operating company as a result of its dissolution. We did not identify any material impediment to dissolving the NMC, and we now anticipate being able to complete the dissolution by the end of first quarter 2017. We will supplement our Reply once the dissolution process is complete.

We have electronically filed this document with the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission, and copies have been served on the parties on the attached service list.
