#### In the Matter of Northwestern Wisconsin Electric Company's Application for Authority to Change its Rates and Rules in Minnesota to Conform to its Rates and Rules in Wisconsin

PUC Docket Number/s: E-016/GR-17-506

**Case Background:** On June 26, 2017, Northwestern Wisconsin Electric Company (NWEC) submitted with its application a proposed notice to customers.

NWEC worked with Commission staff on revisions to this notice that explain how customers may submit comments to the Commission.

# NOTICE OF PROPOSED RATE INCREASE

Northwestern Wisconsin Electric Company (Northwestern) asked the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission for permission to increase its electric rates by approximately \$2,029, or about 2.66%.

The Minnesota Public Utilities Commission makes the decision about Northwestern's request. State law allows Northwestern to begin charging new rates within 60 days of its request. This means the new rates can start August 25, 2017.

# Why is Northwestern asking for an increase?

The proposed increase covers capital, labor, materials, interest, construction, and other costs necessary to provide adequate service.

## Here's how the proposed rate change will affect monthly bills:

The proposed rate increase will affect individual monthly bills differently, depending on the amount of electricity you use and your customer class. This chart shows the proposed rate change's effect on average customer bills.

	Average monthly	Current monthly	Proposed monthly	Approximate
	kWh usage	cost	cost	increase/decrease
Residential	409	\$55.99	\$58.44	4.37%
Rural	489	\$68.69	\$70.04	1.96%
Commercial	724	\$101.41	\$100.43	(0.96%)

## What is the process for reviewing Northwestern's request?

The Minnesota Department of Commerce – Division of Energy Resources, the Office of the Attorney General – Residential Utilities and Antitrust Division, and customers may review and make comments and recommendations about Northwestern's proposal.

The Public Utilities Commission may open an investigation into Northwestern's rates and practices on its own motion or based on a customer complaint.
