NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing on Flying Cow, LLC's certificate of need and site permit applications for its proposed 152 megawatt Bitter Root Wind Project and Associated Facilities in Yellow Medicine County, Minnesota.

The Honorable James E. LaFave, an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) with the Office of Administrative Hearings, will administer this hearing. The purpose of the public hearing is to receive comments regarding the proposed project and the draft site permit issued by the Commission.

Project Description

On October 19 and November 9, 2017, Flying Cow Wind, LLC (the Applicant) submitted applications to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) to construct and operate a large wind energy conversion system (LWECS) in Yellow Medicine County. In order to construct the Bitter Root Wind Project, the applicant must be granted a certificate of need and a site permit from the Commission.

On March 28, 2018 the Applicant filed an addendum to the original application to revise the turbine layout and to increase the number of turbines from 37 to 44 due to unavailability of the larger 4.2 megawatts (MW) turbine originally planned for the project. As a result, the proposed project would entail construction of 44 3.45 MW wind turbines for a combined nameplate capacity of up to 152 MW in Florida, Fortier, and Norman townships in Yellow Medicine County. Facilities associated with the project include underground electrical collection and communication lines, a project substation and interconnection switchyard, an operations and maintenance building, and permanent meteorological towers and gravel access roads.

The applicant is negotiating a power purchase agreement (PPA) for the project, but has also indicated it is prepared to sell the power in a wholesale energy market such as Midcontinent Independent System Operator (MISO) or the Southwest Power Pool (SPP) as an Independent Power Producer, if a PPA is not secured. The applicant asserts the project is intended to meet the growing demand for additional renewable resources and other clean energy requirements in Minnesota and nearby states. If approved, Flying Cow anticipates beginning construction in the 1st quarter of 2019, and commencing operations in the 4th quarter of 2019.

Public Hearing Information

Topics for Public Comment:

- Should the Commission issue a certificate of need and a site permit for the project?
- Is the proposed project needed and in the public interest?
- What are the costs and benefits of the proposed project?
- What are the environmental and human impacts of each site under consideration and how can these impacts be addressed?
- Are there other project-related issues or concerns?

Comment Period: June 12, 2018 through July 18, 2018 at 4:30pm.

Comments received after comment period closes may not be considered.

Process Information

The Commission must approve a certificate of need and a site permit before the project can be built. Flying Cow submitted the certificate of need application in October 2017 and the site permit application was accepted in January 2018. This means the company submitted all the information required to begin the review process.

Minnesota Department of Commerce Energy and Environmental Review and Analysis staff (EERA) has issued an environmental report (Certificate of Need docket) and a preliminary draft site permit (Site Permit docket) for this project. EERA has recommended the Commission issue a draft site permit for the project. The draft site permit is a document prepared for public review and does not constitute Commission approval of the project. The Commission issued the draft site permit for the project on May 25, 2018.

The public hearing is an opportunity for the public to ask questions and submit recommendations for the Commission's consideration in reaching its decision. After the public hearing and comment period, ALJ James E. LaFave will prepare a report for the Commission.

The Commission will review all the information in the record and is anticipated to reach final decisions on the certificate of need and site permit applications in October 2018.

Eminent Domain: The applicant does not have eminent domain authority to acquire land necessary for the project. All leases or easements secured to acquire land for the project are voluntary.
