# **Project Description**

On March 18, 2019, Enbridge Energy, Limited Partnership (Enbridge) filed a *Revised Pipeline Routing Permit and Partial Exemption Application for the Fond du Lac Line 4 Pipeline Project in Saint Louis and Carlton Counties*. The proposed project entails the replacement, relocation, and burial of an approximately 10-mile segment of the Line 4 pipeline on the Fond du Lac Reservation. Construction of the project will allow deactivation, and removal of the existing Line 4 pipeline. Enbridge stated it proposed the project to address concerns raised by the Fond du Lac Band of Superior Chippewa related to the above-grade installation of the subject line because it creates a barrier to natural water flow, as well as impedes land access to tribal resources. Enbridge cited several positive impacts of the project on humans and the environment.

The proposed project would replace an existing 48-inch diameter aboveground pipeline with a 36-inch diameter underground pipeline. Associated facilities with the project include mainline valves, access roads, and cathodic protection equipment. The replacement pipeline would be placed along the south side of the existing Enbridge Mainline Corridor.

Enbridge stated the project would cost approximately \$100 million. The proposed project would be placed in-service in the 3rd Quarter of 2020.

The Commission will decide whether to grant or deny the partial exemption based upon any comments received, the information in the record, and the criteria set forth in Minnesota Rule 7852.0700, Subp. 3. If the Commission does not grant the partial exemption, Enbridge may submit its application pursuant to the Commission's full pipeline route selection procedures.

## **Process Information**

Before the pipeline can be constructed, the Commission must issue a route permit for the project. Enbridge's partial exemption application was accepted as complete by the Commission in April 11, 2019. The Commission's exemption process takes about 90 days.

The public information meeting is intended to inform the public about the permitting process, to compile information to assist the Commission in determining whether to grant or deny the partial exemption application, and to afford an opportunity for members of the public to submit comments. In deciding whether to grant or deny the partial exemption, the Commission will consider comments filed, the information contained in the application and the record as a whole relevant to the criteria for a partial exemption. If the Commission grants a partial exemption, it will issue a pipeline route permit.


