NOTICE OF COMMENT PERIOD ON SITE PERMIT AMENDMENT

In the Matter of the Application of Northern States Power Company (d/b/a Xcel Energy) for a Site Permit Amendment for the up to 200 MW Blazing Star Wind Farm 2 Project in Lincoln County, Minnesota

Comments received after the close of the comment period may or may not be considered by the Commission.

Topic(s) Open for Comment:

- Should the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) amend the Blazing Star Wind Farm 2 site permit to change the number, type and layout of the turbines to be used, as well as expanded project boundaries?
- Should the Commission accept the supplemental environmental impact analysis?
- Should any permit conditions be modified or added if the requested amendments are approved?

Background: On November 6, 2019 the Commission issued a site permit to Blazing Star Wind Farm 2, LLC (Blazing Star 2) to operate the Blazing Star Wind Farm 2 project located in Lincoln County. On April 26, 2019 Xcel Energy filed a Notice of Acquisition and Request for Transfer of the Blazing Star Wind Farm 2 site and route permits. Xcel Energy appeared before the Commission on June 21, 2019 regarding the permit transfers. The Commission issued its order approving the transfer of the permits on July 8, 2019.

On June 19, 2019, Xcel Energy filed a letter requesting amendments to the site permit that include changes to the number, type, and layout of the turbines to be used, as well as expanded project boundaries.


