1 JUDGE LAFAVE: Good morning. My name is 2 Jim LaFave. I'm an Administrative Law Judge with the state Office of Administrative Hearings. 3 We're here this morning for an evidentiary hearing In the 4 Matter of the Application by Dakota Electric 5 Association for Authority to Increase Rates for 6 Electrical Service in Minnesota. 7 8 Would the parties please note their 9 appearances for the record; beginning with Dakota Electric; then the Minnesota Department of Commerce, 10 Division of Energy Resources; and finally, the 11 Office of Attorney General; and then Department 12 Staff. 13 MR. SWANSON: Thank you, Judge. 14 Good Eric Swanson from the law firm of Winthrop 15 morning. and Weinstine on behalf of Dakota Electric 16 17 Association. 18 JUDGE LAFAVE: Thank you. Good morning, Judge. 19 MS. HINDERLIE: Katherine Hinderlie and with me today is Richard 20 21 Dornfeld. We represent the Minnesota Department of 22 Commerce, Division of Energy Resources.

24 MR. MEYER: Good morning, Judge. Joe 25 Meyer on behalf of the Office of the Attorney

JUDGE LAFAVE:

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Thank you.

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1 General, Residential Utilities Division. Assistant 2 Attorney General Max Kieley is appearing with me 3 today. JUDGE LAFAVE: 4 Thank you. 5 MR. BONNETT: Good morning, Judge. Jason Bonnett for the Minnesota Public Utilities 6 Commission. 7 8 JUDGE LAFAVE: Thank you. 9 I will note for the record that on Thursday, January 30th, at the prehearing conference 10 mandated by Minnesota Statute 216B.16 Subdivision 11 12 1a, the parties had reached a general agreement on most of the issues present in this case, so for 13 today's hearing we will admit the exhibits and then 14 discuss the schedule. 15 The Dakota Electric Association submitted 16 17 Exhibits 1 through 53 -- or 55, 1 through 55, and 18 the parties have stipulated to the admission of those exhibits without objection; is that correct, 19 Ms. Hinderlie? 20 21 MS. HINDERLIE: That's correct, Your 22 Honor. 23 JUDGE LAFAVE: Mr. Meyer? That's correct, Your Honor. 24 MR. MEYER: 25 JUDGE LAFAVE: Then without objection,

1 Dakota Electric's Exhibits 1 through 55 are 2 admitted. Also submitted were the Office of 3 Attorney General's Exhibits 1 and 2, and the parties 4 5 have agreed to admit those without objection; is that correct, Mr. Swanson? 6 That's correct, Judge. 7 MR. SWANSON: 8 JUDGE LAFAVE: Ms. Hinderlie? 9 MS. HINDERLIE: Correct, Your Honor. 10 JUDGE LAFAVE: Very good. Then without objection, Office of Attorney General's Exhibits 1 11 and 2 are admitted. 12 And then finally, the Department of 13 Commerce, Division of Energy Resources, has 14 submitted Exhibits 1 through 9. And it's my 15 understanding that there are no objection to those 16 17 exhibits; is that correct, Mr. Swanson? 18 MR. SWANSON: It is, Your Honor. JUDGE LAFAVE: And, Mr. Meyer? 19 20 MR. MEYER: That's correct, Your Honor. 21 JUDGE LAFAVE: Then without exhibits, 22 exhibit -- Department of Commerce Exhibits 1 through 23 9 are admitted. We had a brief discussion prior to going 24 25 on the record, regarding the scheduling of post

1 hearing filings. And it was agreed that Dakota 2 Electric would submit proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law by the close of business on 3 February 28th and that the remaining parties would 4 have until March 12th of 2020, close of business on 5 March 12th to submit any further filings; is that 6 7 correct? MS. HINDERLIE: That's correct, Your 8 9 Honor. Thank you. 10 JUDGE LAFAVE: Mr. Meyer. Yes, Your Honor. 11 MR. MEYER: Thank you. 12 Correct, Judge. MR. SWANSON: Thank you. 13 JUDGE LAFAVE: Very good. Then so ordered. 14 15 Anything further this morning? Mr. Swanson. 16 17 Not from the Cooperative, MR. SWANSON: 18 Your Honor. Thank you. 19 JUDGE LAFAVE: Mr. Meyer. 20 MR. MEYER: Yes, Your Honor. I have just 21 two brief items I would like to put on the record. 22 First of all, in OAG -- Exhibit OAG-1, 23 which was the direct testimony of Ms. Shoua Lee, on page 7 of that testimony, she indicates that Account 24 25 37020 will be fully depreciated by the end of 2021.

And I just want to give the clarification that while 1 2 that is correct, a little more specificity would be to say that that account is also fully depreciated 3 as of the end of 2019. And there's more detail 4 about that depreciation found in Exhibit OAG-2, 5 which is Ms. Lee's surrebuttal testimony. And I 6 just wanted to highlight that clarification given 7 that we're not putting the witnesses on to be 8 9 questioned about that.

And then second of all, in Your Honor's 10 recitation of the exhibits that were admitted, the 11 direct testimony of OAG witness Brian Lebens did not 12 appear on that list, and this was noted in last 13 week's prehearing conference. But that based on the 14 15 agreement of the parties, the OAG indicated that pursuant to Paragraph 22 of Your Honor's first 16 17 prehearing order, we would not be offering it with the understanding that -- that it's considered 18 withdrawn. And I highlight that only because I 19 believe the testimony does continue to appear in the 20 21 eDockets with the Commission, and I just wanted to 22 make sure the record was clear that its lack of 23 admission today is not an oversight but rather a decision made by the parties, and I believe that is 24 also highlighted in the filing letter accompanying 25

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Ms. Lee's surrebuttal testimony. JUDGE LAFAVE: Thank you, Mr. Meyer. Ms. Hinderlie. MS. HINDERLIE: Nothing further for the Department, Your Honor. JUDGE LAFAVE: Thank you very much. Then this matter is under advisement. This hearing is adjourned. Have a good day. Thank you all. (Proceedings concluded at 9:34 a.m.)
