Re: Enbridge's Application for Approval of Route Width Variations and Permit Amendment for the Line 3 Project

In the Matter of the Application of Enbridge Energy, Limited Partnership for a Pipeline Route Permit for the Line 3 Replacement Project in Minnesota from the North Dakota Border to the Wisconsin Border MPUC Docket No. PL-9/PPL-15-137

Dear Mr. Wolf:

Enbridge Energy, Limited Partnership ("Enbridge") submits these reply comments regarding its Application for Approval of Route Width Variations and Permit Amendment ("Modification Request"). As an initial matter, Enbridge acknowledges that the procedural posture of this docket has changed as a result of the Minnesota Court of Appeals' June 3, 2019, decision. As such, Enbridge will not address Friends of Headwaters' May 31, 2019, comments regarding the finality of the routing permit.

Second, Enbridge appreciates the May 31, 2019, comments from the Department of Commerce, Energy Environmental Review and Analysis ("DOC-EERA"). Enbridge agrees with DOC-EERA's conclusions regarding the Modification Request.

Third, Enbridge has reviewed the May 31, 2019, comments submitted by Keith Carlson on behalf of Brandon and Jennifer Suonvieri. The Suonvieris appear to comment regarding Modification Request No. 13, related to the Gowan Pump Station. As noted in the Modification Request, Enbridge has the necessary property rights for this modification, with the exception of a portion of the modification which will be located in existing road right-of-way. As shown on Attachment 1, Modification Request No. 13 does not affect the Suonvieris' property. The location of the Gowan Pump Station site has not changed since Enbridge concluded negotiations

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with the Suonvieris and they executed easement agreements. The Suonvieri residence is approximately 1,000 feet from the area of the requested modification, and there are four other residences in closer proximity. (See attached map.) Both topography and trees will obscure the view of the pump station, and the residence does not have a direct view of the pump station. Given this location, and the Suonvieri residence's distance of approximately only 150 feet from U.S. Highway 2, Enbridge does not agree that the location of the Gowan Pump Station will adversely affect this property. At one time, Enbridge sought to locate the Gowan Pump Station on or near the Suonvieri parcel. However, after negotiations regarding such location were unsuccessful, Enbridge relocated the Gowan Pump Station to its current location, which, as noted, is approximately 1,000 feet from the property. This is the location depicted in the Route Permit, and Requested Modification No. 13 does not move any facilities closer to the Suonvieri parcel or otherwise increase impacts thereupon.
