### Update from the Governors office on July 7, 20

Enclosed you will find the latest update for Minnesota childcare. In the update its stated how the Governors office will continue to support the critical work we do to educate our next generation, support families, and strengthen our economy. Also, it is noted that the avoidance of enclosed spaces, which goes along with our new Covid-19 Preparedness Plan of Ventilation. With construction so loud, and off and on dusty, this is impossible here. I am very close to the road as stated before.

### Unacceptable issues requiring attention:

This week has left me with even more issues. Besides kids up and distracted at rest time due to noise at times, I now have had a baby awaken several times from all the loud construction vehicles. This is not acceptable, neither from a moral standpoint, but also a legal one. Minnesota Administrative Rules Statute 9502.0425 states that infants and newborns need a safe and comfortable space for sleeping. Statute 9502.0415 states many times of quiet times during the day and of space and opportunity for individual rest and quiet time.

Freeborn Wind has known of my daycare since May of 2017, but not acknowledged as a business. They recently asked for the children's sleep schedule. I do not know why as it has shown not to matter. There is absolutely no reason I should have not been taken out of the plan. An established daycare has no business being in an industrial wind plant. I knew this all along and already see how the children are affected, even this early on. I feel just terrible my baby is not allowed to stay sleeping. Knowing I will be speaking up on his behalf, I have taken a video. Again, I took the video as much has been disputed. I am deeply saddened that so far this is allowed. These children also did not sign up for all this. Again, I ask you please to remove T-20 and T-21 from the project.

# **Updates from the Governor**

Today, Governor Tim Walz and Lt. Governor Peggy Flanagan announced \$56.6 million to help support Minnesota child care providers during the COVID-19 pandemic. Governor Walz announced the funding this morning at the Learning Garden in St. Paul and Lieutenant Governor Flanagan highlighted the funding with a visit to a family child care provider in Rochester.

"Child care providers have stepped up to serve emergency workers and ensure families across Minnesota have a safe and reliable place to send their children," said Governor Walz. "We will continue to support the critical work they do to educate our next generation, support families, and strengthen our economy."

At the start of the pandemic, Governor Walz and Lt. Governor Flanagan asked child care providers to stay open to support the families of emergency workers. Providers responded to this call by diligently working to serve their communities despite great challenges, including significant costs due to decreasing group sizes and cleaning, staffing, and workflow changes needed to keep children healthy and safe. In Minnesota, child care access, especially for health care and other emergency workers, remains critical to the state's public health response — an estimated 420,000 children are in households with one or two working parents in a tier one or two critical sector.

"Minnesota child care providers have gone above and beyond to support children and families during these unprecedented months," said Lieutenant Governor Flanagan. "To meet the great need, and despite great challenges, providers have stayed open, including 90% of family providers. Our response to COVID-19 could not have happened without their support. They care for our littlest Minnesotans, and we should support them in return."

Once funding is approved, DHS and the Children's Cabinet will provide information about how childcare providers can apply for the grants. Families seeking care can call the Child Care Aware parent line at 1.888.291.9811 or visit mn.gov/childcare for a map of open providers.

### Everyone can work to reduce the spread of COVID-19

- Wear masks when in public. 10-50% of virus carriers are asymptomatic wearing masks helps control the virus and has been shown to lower COVID-19 spread.
- Avoid enclosed spaces with groups of people, where the virus can linger in the air for long periods of time.
- Get tested if you have cold or flu-like symptoms <u>Find testing locations</u>.
- Stay six feet away from others.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with your elbow or sleeve, or a tissue and then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands afterwards.
- Washing your hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom or before eating. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your face especially your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
