ORDER AMENDING SITE PERMIT TO CHANGE PERMITTEE NAME

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On April 13, 2006, the Commission issued an Order Granting Site Permit for a large wind energy conversion system in this docket to Fenton Power Partners, LLC, for the Fenton Wind Project in Murray and Nobles Counties.

On November 7, 2007, enXco Development Corporation, on behalf of Fenton Power Partners, LLC, filed a letter requesting that the Commission amend its April 13, 2006 Order to add the Roman numeral "I" to the name of the permittee (Fenton Power Partners, LLC), acknowledging that an error in its original site permit application omitted the Roman numeral "I" from the name of the project company.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

Under Minn. Rules 7836.1300, subp. 2, a permittee may request an amendment of its site permit for a large wind energy conversion system, and the Commission may approve an amendment of a wind site permit, at any time the Commission has good cause to do so. This minor correction to the permittee's legal name establishes the necessary good cause to approve the requested amendment.

Finally, no one objected or expressed concern about the requested name change after adequate notice to all potentially interested persons.

ORDER

- 1. The April 13, 2006, site permit issued in this docket is amended to change the name of the permittee from Fenton Power Partners, LLC, to Fenton Power Partners I, LLC.
- 2. This Order shall become effective immediately.

ORDER VARYING RULE AND EXTENDING TIME LINE FOR COMMISSION ACTION

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Wisconsin Power & Light Company (Wisconsin Power & Light) proposes to build a 200 megawatt wind facility in northwest Freeborn County, Minnesota, and intends to file a certificate of need.

On November 6, 2007, Wisconsin Power & Light filed a request for exemption from certain certificate of need content requirements.¹

On November 20, 2007, the Commission issued a notice of comment period, asking interested person for comments on the Applicant's exemption request. Under the terms of the notice, initial comments were due on December 6 and reply comments on December 17.

The thirty-day time period for Commission review of Applicant's exemption request expired on December 6, 2007. On December 13, 2007, the Commission met to consider extending the 30-day time period set by rule for acting on the petition. No one objected to extending the deadline for Commission action to ensure proper review of the petition.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

I. The Legal Standard

The certificate of need rules require the Commission to respond in writing to exemption requests within 30 days of the date they are filed. Minn. Rules, part 7849.0200, subp. 6. The Commission's rules of practice and procedure permit it to vary any of its rules upon making the following findings:

- (1) enforcement of the rule would impose an excessive burden upon the applicant or others affected by the rule;
- (2) granting the variance would not adversely affect the public interest; and
- (3) granting the variance would not conflict with standards imposed by law.

Minn. Rules, part 7829.3200, subp. 1.

II. Commission Action

The Commission has reviewed the applicant's exemption request and finds that careful consideration will require more than 30 days.

The applicant seeks exemption from the following content requirements for certificate of need applications:

- Minn. Rules 7849.0240, subp. 2(B), Promotional Activities
- Minn. Rules 7849.0250 (A)(4), Heat Rate of Facility
- Minn. Rules 7849.0250 (B)(1)-(5), Discussion of the Availability of Alternatives to the Facility
- Minn. Rules 7849.0250 (C)(1)-(9), Details of the Availability of Alternatives to the Facility
- Minn. Rules 7849.0250 (D), Map of Applicant's System
- Minn. Rules 7849.0250 (E), Other Information
- Minn. Rules 7849.0270, Peak Demand and Annual Consumption Forecast
- Minn. Rules 7849.0280, System Capacity
- Minn. Rules 7849.0290, Conservation Programs
- Minn. Rules 7849.0300, Consequences of Delay
- Minn. Rules 7849.0320 (A)-(K), Generating Facilities
- Minn. Rules 7849.0330, Transmission Facilities
- Minn. Rules 7849.0340, the Alternative of No Facility

While it is important not to burden an applicant with unnecessary or unperformable filing requirements, it is equally important not to forgo information that will be needed once the certificate of need case begins. The Commission has solicited comments from interested persons to help it avoid both hazards. Receiving and analyzing those comments will require this petition to remain open for more than 30 days.

The Commission will therefore vary the 30-day time line of Minn. Rules, part 7849.0200, subp. 6, making the following findings:

- (1) Enforcing the 30-day time line would impose an excessive burden upon the public, upon parties to the proceeding, and upon the Commission, by jeopardizing the thoroughness of the Commission's decision-making process;
- (2) Varying the 30-day time line would not adversely affect the public interest and would in fact serve the public interest by protecting the Commission's decision-making process, and clarifying early-on in the proceeding what should be filed; and
- (3) Varying the 30-day time line would not conflict with any other standard imposed by law.

The Commission will promptly review the comments of the parties and will act on the Applicant's petition as soon as practicable.

The Commission will so order.

ORDER

- 1. Minn. Rules, part 7849.0200, subp. 6 is hereby varied to extend the time for Commission action on the Applicant's exemption request, as set forth herein.
- 2. This Order shall become effective immediately.


