# Comments of the Minnesota Department of Commerce Division of Energy Resources

Docket No. IP7041/CN-20-764

### I. INTRODUCTION

On October 12, 2020 Byron Solar, LLC (Byron or the Company) filed the Company's *Certificate of Need Notice Plan Approval Request* (Notice Petition). The Notice Petition provides the Company's proposed notice plan to communicate an intent to construct an approximately 5-mile 345-kV transmission line between Byron's up to 200-MW solar generating plant in Dodge County and the existing Byron Substation in Olmsted County (Project). The Notice Petition includes a draft notice for landowners, residents, and governmental jurisdictions, along with a draft newspaper notice.

Also on October 12, 2020 Byron filed an exemption petition; the exemption petition will be addressed in separate comments.

Below are the comments of the Minnesota Department of Commerce, Division of Energy Resources (Department) regarding the Notice Petition.

#### II. DEPARTMENT ANALYSIS

#### A. GOVERNING STATUTES AND RULES

The Company filed the Notice Petition pursuant to Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2550 subpart 1 which states, in part:

Three months before filing a certificate of need application for a high-voltage transmission line as defined by Minnesota Statutes, section 216B.2421, the applicant shall file a proposed plan for providing notice to all persons reasonably likely to be affected by the proposed line.

Minnesota Statutes § 216B.2421 includes in its definition of a Large Energy Facility (LEF):

(2) any high-voltage transmission line with a capacity of 200 kilovolts or more and greater than 1,500 feet in length

Given that the proposed Project involves a 345-kV transmission line approximately 5 miles long and the overall Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) goal of involving the local community in Commission proceedings, the Department concludes that the proposed 345-kV transmission line requires a notice plan.

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#### B. TYPES OF NOTICE

Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2550, subpart 3, requires types of notice as follows:

- A. direct mail notice, based on county tax assessment rolls, to landowners reasonably likely to be affected by the proposed transmission line;
- B. direct mail notice to all mailing addresses within the area reasonably likely to be affected by the proposed transmission line;
- C. direct mail notice to tribal governments and to the governments of towns, statutory cities, home rule charter cities, and counties whose jurisdictions are reasonably likely to be affected by the proposed transmission line; and
- D. newspaper notice to members of the public in areas reasonably likely to be affected by the proposed transmission line.

Regarding the notice to landowners, Byron "plans to review the county tax assessment rolls and other relevant county records to determine the names and addresses of those landowners who own property within or adjacent to the proposed transmission line corridor." The notice area is shown on the site location map on the final page of the Notice Petition.

Regarding the notice to mailing addresses, Byron "intends to mail notice to all mailing addresses within or adjacent to the proposed transmission line corridor." Addresses will be gathered by Byron from mailing lists maintained by the United States Post Office or from bulk mailing firms. Note that the list of landowners and the list of mailing addresses will be merged and notification letters will be sent to those persons on the resulting list.

Regarding notice to governmental jurisdictions reasonably likely to be affected by the proposed Project, Byron "proposes to provide direct mail notice to all tribal governments located in Minnesota."

Regarding newspaper notice, Byron plans to publish a notice in the *Rochester Post Bulletin* and the *Dodge County Independent*.

After reviewing the above data, the Department concludes that, with the addition of the city of Byron, Dodge County, and Olmsted County to the governmental notice list, the proposal regarding types of notice is reasonable.

## C. CONTENT OF NOTICE

Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2550, subpart 4 require the notices to provide the following information:

A. a map showing the end points of the line and existing transmission facilities in the area;

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- B. a description of general right-of-way requirements for a line of the size and voltage proposed and a statement that the applicant intends to acquire property rights for the right-of-way that the proposed line will require;
- C. a notice that the line cannot be constructed unless the commission certifies that it is needed;
- D. the commission's mailing address, telephone number, and website;
- E. if the applicant is a utility subject to chapter 7848, the address of the website on which the utility applicant will post or has posted its biennial transmission projects report required under that chapter;
- F. a statement that the Environmental Quality Board<sup>[1]</sup> will be preparing an environmental report on each high-voltage transmission line for which certification is requested;
- G. a brief explanation of how to get on the mailing list for the Environmental Quality Board's proceeding; and
- H. a statement that requests for certification of high-voltage transmission lines are governed by Minnesota law, including specifically chapter 4410, parts 7849.0010 to 7849.0400, and 7849.1000 to 7849.2100, and Minnesota Statutes, section 216B.243.

The Department reviewed the attached notice, letters and map provided by the Company and concludes that the proposal for the resident/landowner notice, governmental notice, and newspaper notice contains the required information.

# D. NOTICE TIMING

Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2550, subpart 6, requires the applicant to implement the notice plan within 30 days of its approval by the Commission. Byron did not request a variance to this rule. However, in past certificate of need (CN) proceedings notice generally was provided no more than 60 days and no less than two weeks prior to the filing of the CN application.<sup>2</sup> To ensure that notice timing is calibrated to the CN application date, the Department recommends that the Commission vary Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2550, subpart 6 to require this change in the notice timing.

Minnesota Rules, part 7829.3200 governs such variance requests and establishes the following criteria:

- A. enforcement of the rule would impose an excessive burden upon the applicant or others affected by the rule;
- B. granting the variance would not adversely affect the public interest; and
- C. granting the variance would not conflict with standards imposed by law.

The Department concludes that enforcement of the rule would burden all parties involved by potentially separating the provision of notice from the start of the proceeding. Granting the variance would not

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adversely affect the public interest since the Department's proposal would more closely tie the implementation of the notice plan to the beginning of the CN proceeding. The Department is not aware that the variance would conflict with standards imposed by law. Therefore, the Department recommends that the Commission approve the implementation of the notice plan no more than 60 days and no less than two weeks prior to the filing of the CN petition.

# E. NEWSPAPER NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the newspaper notice discussed above, Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2500, subpart 5, requires Byron to publish newspaper notice of the CN filing in newspapers of general circulation throughout the state. In the Notice Petition, Byron proposed to publish a notice in the *Rochester Post Bulletin* and the *Dodge County Independent*. Both selected newspapers are local.

The Department recommends that the Commission order a statewide newspaper be added to the newspaper notice list. However, the Department recommends that the Commission simplify the notification process by approving a variance to the requirement to publish that notice at the time of the CN application—instead the statewide newspaper notice should be published at the same time as the other notice documents. The analysis above regarding a variance applies in this situation as well. In summary, the Department concludes that, with the addition of a statewide newspaper, the Company's proposed plan for newspaper notice is reasonable.

### III. CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Department recommends that the Commission approve the Notice Petition, as modified by the following:

- require the Company to add the city of Byron, Dodge County, and Olmsted County to the governmental notice list;
- approve a variance to Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2550, subpart 6 to allow the notice plan to be implemented no more than 60 days and no less than two weeks prior to the filing of the CN petition;
- require the Company to add a statewide newspaper to the newspaper notice list; and
- approve a variance to Minnesota Rules, part 7829.2500, subpart 5 to allow the statewide newspaper notice to be published at the same time as the other notice documents.
