The Commission met on **Friday, May 8, 2015**, with Chair Heydinger and Commissioners Lange, Lipschultz, Tuma, and Wergin present.

The following matters were taken up by the Commission:

P-999/CI-12-1329 In the Matter of the Commission Investigation of the Completion of Long-Distance Calls to Rural Areas in Minnesota

Commissioner Lipschultz moved that the Commission

- 1. reconsider on its own initiative its October 31, 2014 Order Modifying and Clarifying July 21, 2014 Order and
- 2. modify the October 31 Order to require originating interexchange carriers doing business in Minnesota to report to the Commission and the Department on a quarterly basis all call-completion complaints except those regarding calls intended to terminate in area codes 612, 651, 763, and 952.

The motion passed 5–0.

P-6716,5615/C-14-383

In the Matter of the Complaint of the Minnesota Department of Commerce (DOC) Against the Charter Affiliates Regarding Transfer of Customers

Chair Heydinger moved to take the following actions:

- 1. find that Charter's interconnected VoIP service is a telecommunication service subject to the Commission's authority under Minn. Stat. ch. 237 and related Commission rules;
- 2. direct Charter to file within 30 days of the Commission's order a description of how Charter will comply with that order and a draft notice to its customers informing them that Charter provides a regulated telephone service and outlining the customer protections provided by law; and
- 3. allow the parties 30 days to comment on Charter's compliance filing and authorize the Executive Secretary to alter the comment periods for good cause.

The motion passed 5–0.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
